Air-Rail Service Is Northwestern Project

The Chicago & North Western Railway will begin air service for the first time May 1, when a rail-air tie-up that will cut six hours from the running schedule between Middle Western cities and the Black Hills of South Dakota is started in conjunction with the Rapid Air Lines, Inc., according to C. A. Cairns, Passenger Traffic Manager of the railway.

The service will be concentrated in South Dakota with Huron and Rapid City as the key cities, and will expedite summer tourist service between the Black Hills and Chicago, Minneapolis, St. Paul, Omaha, and Sioux City. Trains will connect with a west-bound plane at Huron leaving every morning at 9:15, and arriving at Rapid City, the gateway to the Hills, three and one-half hours later. Eastbound planes will leave Rapid City at 1:30 p. m. for Huron connecting with trains at that point in all directions.
