

Public Service Co. Financial Reports

Public Service Company of Northern Illinois reports for the quarter ended March 31, 1929, a net income of \$2,081,479 after all charges, including depreciation, interest and taxes, compared with \$1,827,926 for the corresponding quarter last year. Gross revenues for the period amount-

ed to \$8,519,925, compared with \$7,649,059. For the 12 months ended March 31, 1929, the company reports a net income of \$6,107,007, compared with \$5,610,685 for the previous 12 months, and a gross of \$30,387,135 compared with \$27,122,581.

Winnetka to Supply Water to Northfield

The Village of Winnetka has authorized a contract with Northfield to provide that municipality with water for a period of ten years, at a price of 18 cents per thousand gallons, says the Winnetka Talk.

Negotiations looking toward this arrangement have been underway for several months, and the ordinance authorizing the contract was passed at the meeting of the Winnetka Village Council last week.

Water is to be delivered by Winnetka at the west limits of the village, on Willow road. For the present, it is announced, it will be supplied through the existing distribution system, by means of a short extension in Willow road, west of Glendale avenue.

It is planned, however, in case the growth of Northfield warrants, to provide a feeder main in Tower road, from Linden avenue west to Hibbard road thence south in Hibbard road to Willow road.

Evanston Golf Club Has New Member Plan
