Handling Wet and Soggy Places by Drainage

In order to be sure that all the seep water is cut off from your yard, it is necessary not only to drain the low places but along the side hill as well. Drain on heavy clay soil should be placed not more than thirty feet apart. On sandy soil forty or fifty feet is close enough. Where ordinary farm tile are used, they should be put in not less than two feet, in order to prevent frequent freezing and thawing and the crumbling of the tile.

The drain should be taken to a natural outlet or to a catch basin. If there is not plenty of fall or water to level with, an instrument or level should be used. Two or three inches per hundred feet is very ample.

Selecting Your Perennials for the Border

The first row on the border should contain low plants such as Pansies, Rock Arabis, Tunica, Dianthus Caessius, Campanula Carpatica or any other low growing perennial.

The second height perennials are Rammunculus (Buttercup) Pyretheum, Canterbury Bell, Aquilegia, Sweet Williams, Shasta Daisies,

Dwarf Chinese Delphinium, Oriental that is necessary, but has no humous. ines, Stokesia Scabiosa, Veronica, Day Lillies. The Widar, Wanadis and soil. Fifty pounds to a thousand Lumbineaux also Miss Lingard Phlox go well in this second border.

The next series of plants in the border, should be of height ranging from twenty-four to thirty-six inches, which include the tall varieties of Phlox such as Jeanne D'Arc, Henry Murger, Viking and Riverton Jewel, Hemerocallis, Citrinna, Artemesia Lactifolia, English Hybrids, Delphinium, Rudbeckit Purpurea, Japan Lillies, Aconitum, Peonies, Foxglove, Pyretheum Uliginosum, Siberian Iris, and for the tallest border in the back use the Boltonia, Hollyhocks, Liatris Anchusa, Hardy Asters Rudbeckia Lacinata, Hibiscus, Physotegia.
