be on Wednesday, May 8, in the Durand Art Institute. Through the endeavors of the local committee, reserved seats may be secured in exchange for members tickets at Krafft's drug store, on Thursday, May 2, and any day thereafter.

The management suggests that reserved seats be obtained as early in the week as possible, at both stores, since audiences are usually large for the final productions, and good seats will be exhausted quickly.

Three-Act Comedy

The play is a three-act comedy by John Hastings Turner. Its London production received the endorsement of the British Drama league, a thing hard to obtain. The play deals in a lively way with the courtship and marriage of the twin daughters of the country Vicar, and the double loves, the situations and the wit and satire will delight the most particular North Shore audience.

Cast in the difficult roles of the twins are Irene Wicker of Evanston and Agnes Biesemier of Wilmette. Miss Biesemier will make her debut with the guild in the production, and Irene Wicker will be remembered for her playing of the role of the young matron in "Tons of Money," in 1928. Opposite the twins, as their admirers and lovers, are Joseph K. Shippen of Glencoe and Arthur Landers of Winnetka. Mr. Shippen plays "Barnaby Haddon," the antiquarian whose

knowledge of mid-Victorianism extends even to its damsels, and Mr. Landers is cast as Byran Ropes, the young society blade and faddist of London.

Other Roles

Robert G. McMillian and Ethel Re-pass, both of Glencoe, will enact the roles of Rev. John Head and his wife, Ann. Their characterizations are not easy, and their acting will be noted with especial interest because they, too, are newcomers to the guild stage. As Mrs. Rooke-Walter of London, the mother of Mrs. Head and leader of London society, Dale Plympton of Winnetka will appear. Sally Noherty of Evanston, and as the Hon. Monica Flame, and Mary C. White and Janet Marshall of Winnetka, as Lady Susan Rocker and Violet, the maid, complete the cast.

The group is now in intensive rehearsal under the direction of David Owen.
