The following report of the Deerfield Public Library Association is submitted for your information. It will give you the opportunity, we hope, to better understand what has been accomplished in two years, where the support of the library came from and what was done with your money.

The Deerfield Public Library Association was incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois, not for profit. The following citizens were the incorporators and served as trustees and officers for the first year,—Wm. W. Geary, President; Charles C. Kapschull, Vice-President; Mrs. Walter B. Metcalf, Secretary; Jessie Strong, Treasurer; James J. Hood, Mrs. F. W. Russo. The library was formally opened January 1, 1927.

The trustees of the Deerfield Public Library Association now stand ready to release their trust and turn over to the trustees of the West Deerfield Township Public Library, all the assets, books, furnishings, etc. in accordance with their pledge to the people when they voted for the library tax a year ago. We are advised that this income is now available thus assuring the success of the library.

We are pleased to advise you that the circulation for January, February and March of this year has averaged over 1000 books taken from the library each month.

To the readers of Deerfield, young and old—our contact with you has been a happy one and if we have helped you in any way, we are glad.
