Mr. and Mrs. Carl Pfanstiehl of Woodpath road, have returned from two weeks spent in New York.

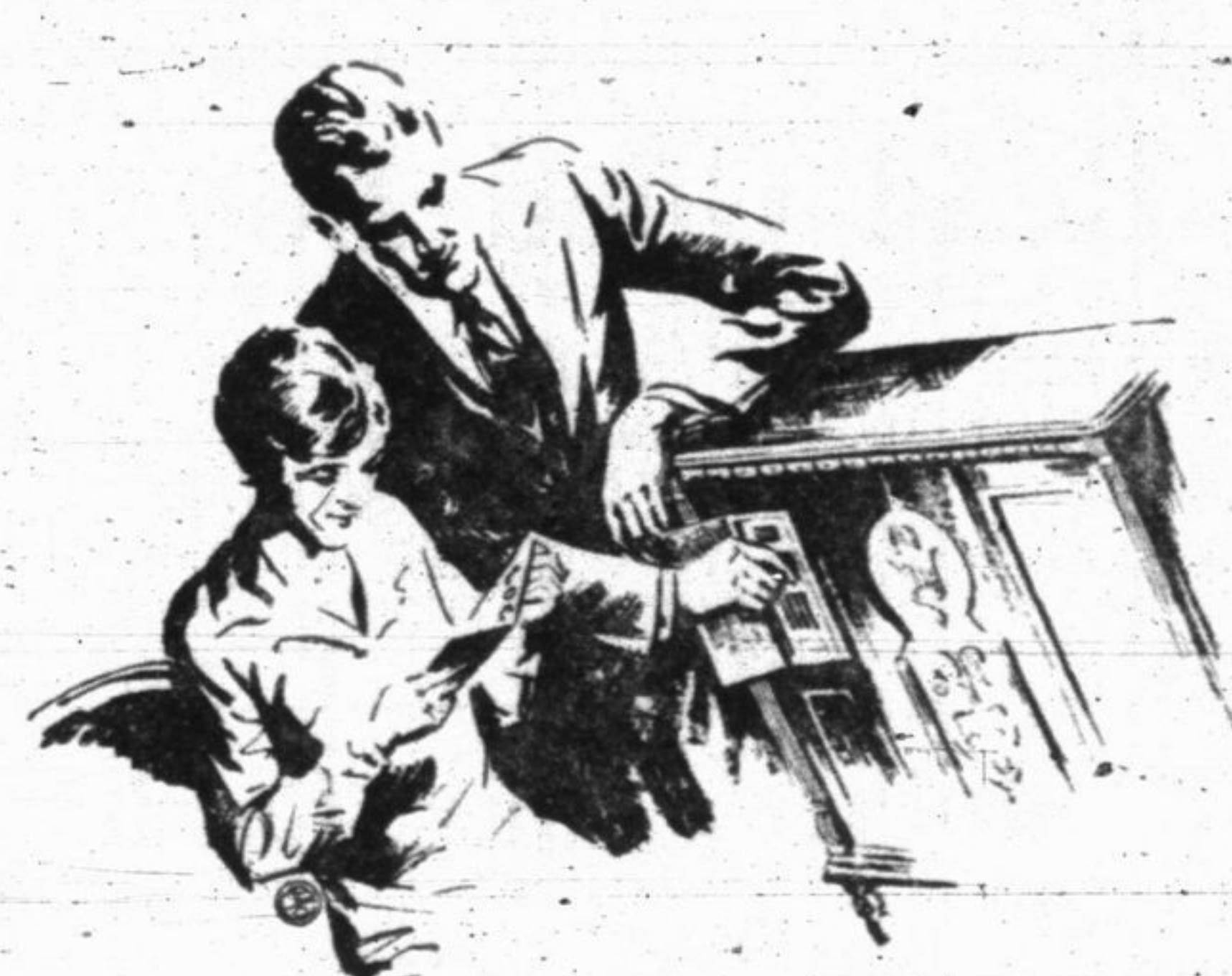
