

Music Association Festival on May 5

The Civic association of Chicago, which will give its annual festival at Orchestra hall, Sunday afternoon, May 5, at 3:30, promises a program of more than ordinary interest. This will have as an important feature a number of folk songs from European nations which will be sung by a children's chorus of 1000 voices.

In past seasons these folk songs and

the beautiful interpretation of them by the fresh young voices of the children have brought great delight to the hearts of hundreds of people from the older countries. This year the folk songs are of exceptional charm and, in addition to them, the chorus will sing a group of works by American composers as well as the cantata 'Vogelweid the Minnesinger.' The Civic Orchestra, directed by Eric De Lamarter, will play three brilliant

symphonic works and there will be also a demonstration of community singing.

Echo of Rondout Mail Robbery Seen in Suit

Hearing on the \$26,000 claim against the estate of the late Lee O'Neil Browne, filed by relatives of James Murray, who was convicted

several months ago for participation in the Rondout, Ill., mail robbery, has been set for May 6, at Ottawa, Ill.

The document asserted that the claim represented a prepaid and unearned legal fee given to Browne in 1925, when he was retained to seek Murray's release from the federal penitentiary at Atlanta. The plaintiffs are Mrs. Jennie Murray, Murray's wife; Michael Murray, his father, and Mrs. Nellie Murray, his stepmother.

NORTHWESTERN UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL PROSPECTS

3000 Northwestern students and alumni turned out last Saturday afternoon at Dycke Stadium to see the Varsity battle the Freshmen in their annual spring football game. The Varsity won 13-7, but they were forced to extend themselves to do so—the deciding touchdown being made by Hank Burder in the final minutes of play.

The game was, of course, very ragged. The Freshmen were continually penalized for off side play, while the Varsity boys were often punished for stalling in the huddle. To Northwestern fans the game was particularly interesting because of the excellent material on the yearling squad. The work of their line was especially gratifying, while such men as Moore, Baxter, and Marvil in the backfield was encouraging to those who were working for flashy, open field running.

It was also evident that the new rule on the fumble would cause considerable argument next fall. Under this new ruling a fumble is dead at the point of recovery. Nor is there anything to prevent an intentional fumble. For example, one team may be leading 7-6. The opposing team, getting within a few yards of the goal, but unable to break through for a touchdown, may intentionally fumble the ball across the line—and win the game regardless of which team recovers. From the viewpoint of the spectator, this new rule is extremely unpopular; and it is the general belief that it will not weather more than the one reason.
