Other good varieties are the Sir Watkins, Victoria Emperor, Glory of Sassenheim, Golden Spur. A good double variety is the Von Zion.

The other small bulbs that have been very attractive this Spring are the Scilla Siberica, Crocus, and Muscari Heavenly Blue. The single early tulips are right now at their prime of the season and it is an excellent time to select your bedding varieties, as there are too many shades, types and colors to describe.

#### Planting of Water Lilies

There has been a considerable interest taken in the growing of water lilies. The soil for water lilies should be mixed half and half with cow manure and a liberal quantity of horn shavings should be added and a top layer of two inches of sand. Boxes eight inches or a foot deep and about two foot square will be found very convenient way of handling them where there is not a natural pocket in the pool made during construction.

## Bedding Plants


