Del Rio and Farrell Star in "Red Dance"

Teamed for the first time in their career, Dolores Del Rio and Charles Farrell give a remarkable performance in the stellar roles of "The Red Dance," which has its local premier on the screen of the Alcyon theatre Tuesday night. Separately and together these two young people held the audience spellbound by their fine characterizations. She as the peasant girl who becomes the famous "Red Dancer of the Revolution," he as the Grand Duke Eugen, whom she tries to save from the vengeance of the people. Another great performance is that of Ivan Linow, the giant Russian who, as a private soldier, woos Del Rio but who when he becomes a "Red" general, saves her lover from the firing squad. "The Red Dancer" is splendid not only as an entertainment, but as a

vivid picture of revolutionary Russia. It abounds in thrills, such as when the cossacks are shown sweeping down on a defenseless village, the revolt of the prisoners in the salt mines, and many similar episodes. But this is not a gloomy picture. There is much humor, fine romance, and much beauty of scenery in this production.

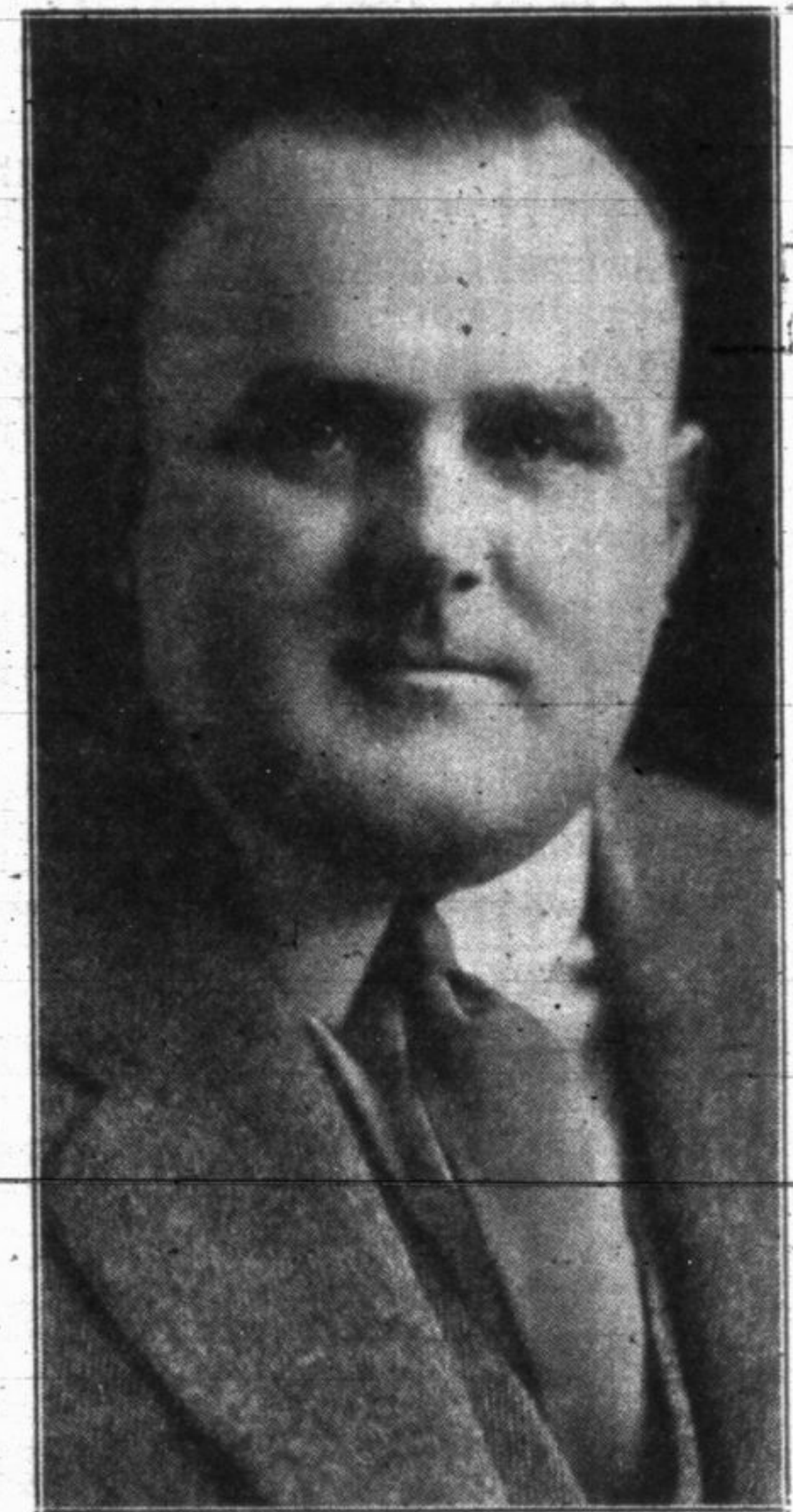
