High Water Menaces Waukegan Warehouse

Employes of the Waukegan city water department on Monday afternoon started reinforcing, the city warehouse on the lake front to keep it from falling into the harbor. Commissioner Robert J. Pearsall stated that the rise of six inches in Lake Michigan last Thursday believed to have been caused by the rainstorm and strong east wind, caused considerably more of the already weakened piling to wash out from under the warehouse. Posts were placed under the building and sand bags are piled behind them in in an effort to save the structure.

Commissioner Pearsall said that the rise of the lake lasted for six hours Thursday, after which it gradually lowered. An appropriation of \$16,000 is being sought from the city to repair damage done to the city State highway engineers closed docks this spring by the rise of the water.
