

### Expect Sheridan Road to Be Open By June 1

Sheridan road, south of Zion, where a washout occurred a few weeks ago, will be opened June 1, according to information given to R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, by S. C. Wright, state engineer in charge of building the culvert, today.

Wright's men finished pouring concrete for the footings and started pouring the first tunnel late last week. There are to be two tunnels, 8x10 feet wide.

Traffic will be allowed over the road long before the culvert, which was washed out by a rain, will be completed. More than 1,000 letters

condemning the state highway department for its slowness have been received. The fact is, according to Lobdell, that the state is ahead of its schedule.

Last time when Vercoe ran for office members of the board, hearing that he intended to retire, were forced to argue with him for several days in order to get him to remain.

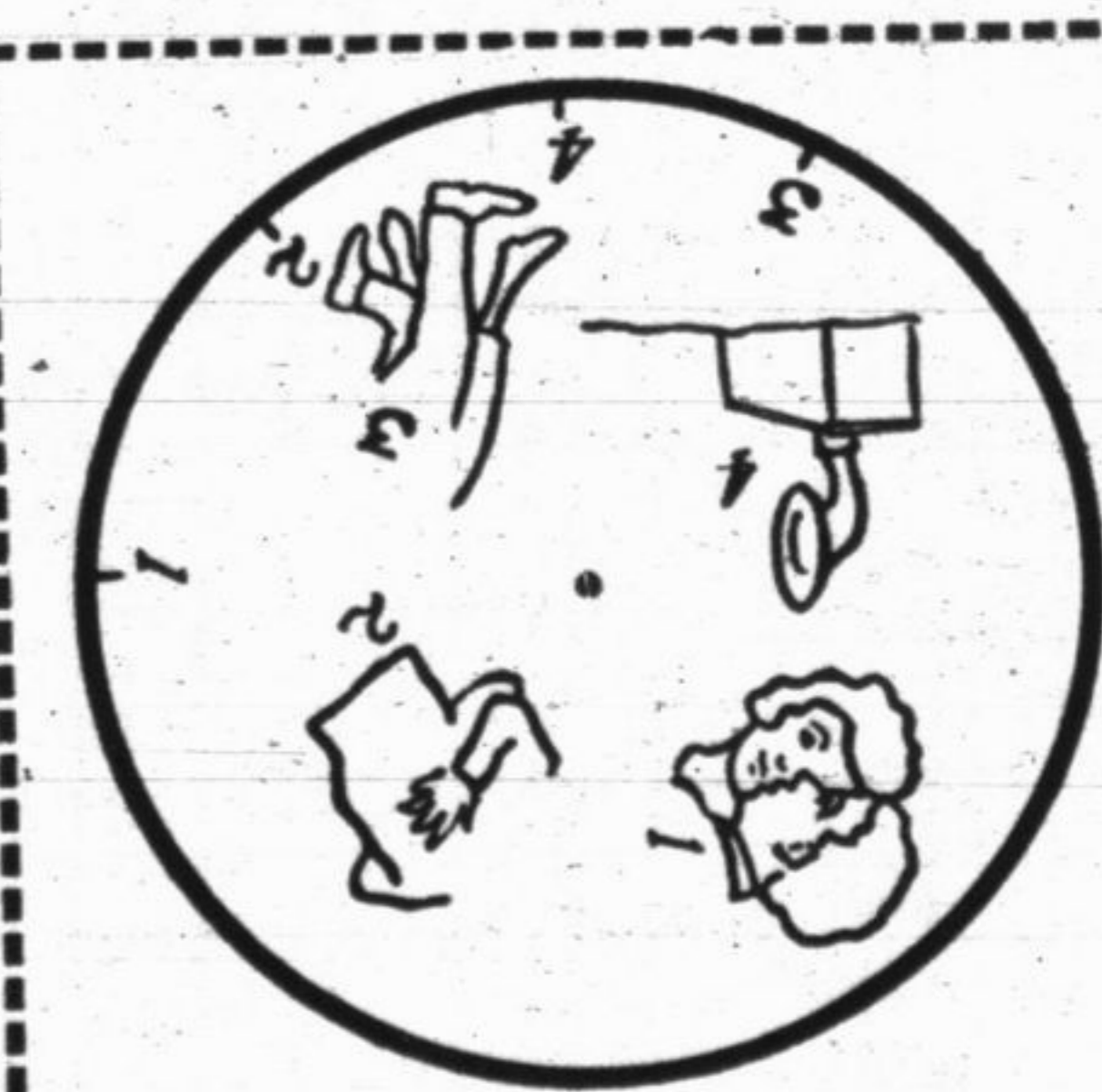
