### CARPENTERS VOTE ON PAY INCREASE

Contractors Offer 50c Boost Instead of Dollar Asked; Now Get \$12 a Day

Carpenters and affiliated groups in Waukegan and Lake county have been voting in the last week on the issue as to whether they will accept the offer of contractors and builders for an increase of 50 cents a day in wages which has been made in compromise to the request of workmen for a boost of \$1 a day.

The wage of carpenters will be \$12.50 a day if the offer is accepted. The present wage for the eight hour day is \$12.

The possibility of a five day week for all building tradesmen in Waukegan and Lake county is remote in the opinion of union officials. Two unions, the plasterers and the painters, now operate under this schedule, and there is a general movement throughout the country for the adoption of such a working schedule by all building trades.

It is considered likely that the shorter week will be a matter of discussion preceding the making of new contracts between building tradesmen and the contractors on June 1, but what will be done about it is still too uncertain to predict as the individual workers have not expressed their opinions in the matter.

Max L. Baade, business agent for the carpenters union in Lake county, declared last week, according to the Waukegan Sun, that the five day week will not be asked by his union this year. At least there has been no discussion along these lines as yet and little interest has been shown in the matter by carpenters.

### Hospital Room to Be Memorial to Limberry

Motivated largely by public opinion, the various committees of the Limberry Memorial fund at Libertyville in a meeting held in the office of the chamber of commerce, on Wednesday afternoon, of last week, voted to turn all paid and unpaid monies to the fund over to the establishing of a children's room in the Condell Memorial hospital in that city.

Following a thorough investigation by the committee heads into the proposition, it was determined not to erect a memorial in tribute to the late police chief, and to use it for the establishing of a children's room at the hospital. It is believed that the latter proposition would bring far more tribute to the memory of Dennis Limberry, as much of his life was undoubtedly directed by the love he bore for the children.

### Opposes State Income Tax in Open Letter

Hugh W. Fisher of Waukegan, chief clerk to the commandant of the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, has written a letter to State Representative Lee McDonough in which he urges the local legislator to exert his influence to bring about the defeat of the proposed State Income Tax law. The bill already has passed the House and now goes to the Senate. Mr. Fisher takes the position that the average person already is overtaxed.
