Mrs. Carl Olson of Ridgewood drive is entertaining a few of her son's friends at a party tomorrow afternoon in honor of his birthday anniversary.

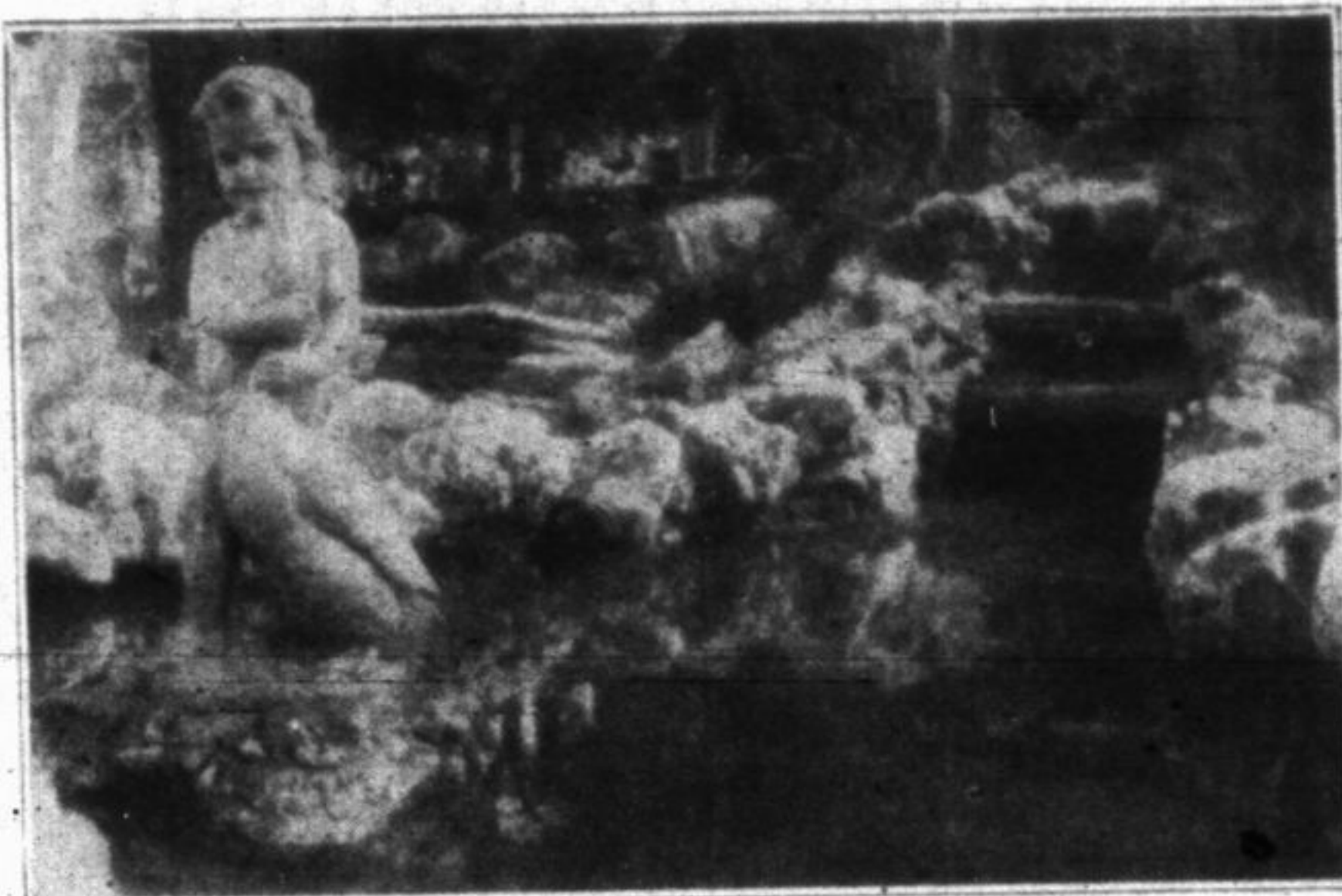
Mr. and Mrs. Louis F. Hoppe returned Monday from Des Moines, Ia., where Mrs. Hoppe spent the past two
