**Interesting Happenings About
This Part of North Shore;
County Seat**

Leroy Judson Ames, a prominently known resident of Libertyville and who had resided in Lake county for all of his 76 years of life died at his home, 222 South Milwaukee avenue, last week from pneumonia.
