machine in process of manufacture and also demonstrated on the streets. They also visited another sweeper factory in another city in the same way.

In Other Cities.

Two weeks ago the same party went to Kenosha, Racine and Milwaukee, in which cities Elgin sweepers are in use and talked with operators, mechanics and city officials in charge of the machines. They studied the contour of streets, corner arcs, etc., and were convinced that this sweeper was best adapted to use in Highland Park. The purchase of the sweeper was approved by the city council at its meeting Monday evening.

It is planned to sweep all the residence streets about every ten days and those in the business district at least twice a week. The machine is provided with a receptacle which carries two yards of dirt, so that it needs to be dumped only at intervals and at points easily accessible for trucks which will haul the refuse to the dumping ground.

Herman Hart Operator

An expert is furnished by the Elgin company to start the machine here and to remain with it for a week or two until Herman Hart, who will operate it here, is thoroughly familiar with it.

Commissioner W. J. Brown has spent a great deal of time and thought in regard to this improvement of the facilities of his department, and it is expected that it will prove as successful as the efficient grader which the city purchased at his recommendation last year, and which has proved to be a good investment in the way of economical operation in this line.
