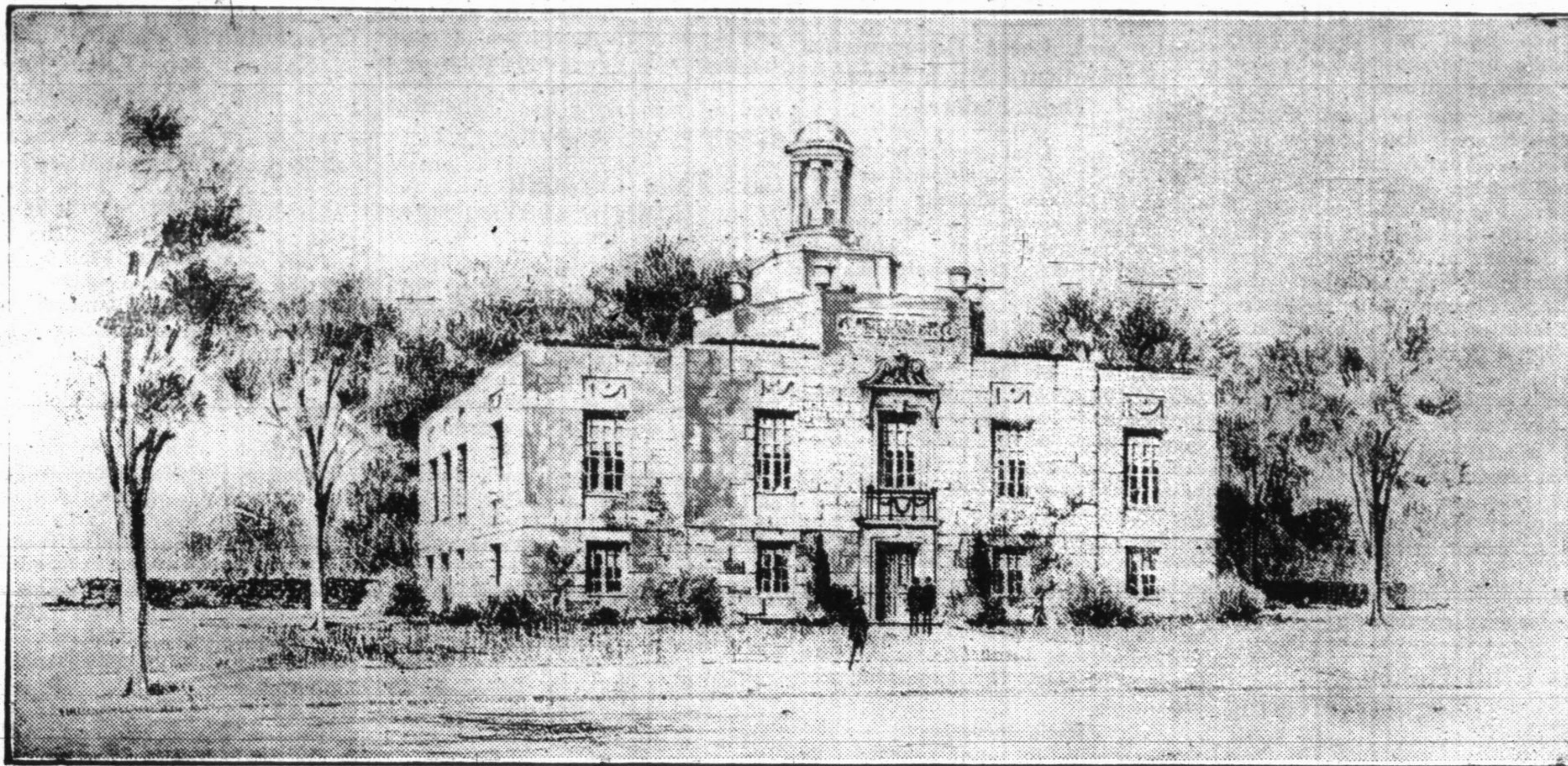


Proposed New City Building for Construction of Which Bids Will Be Opened May 20

On Second Floor

On the second floor will be located the council chamber which will be 49.2 by 26 feet in dimensions, with offices grouped about it. Here will be the offices of the mayor, the city clerk, the corporation counsel and the city collector, and a room also is provided for a court room for the hearing of city cases.

The city council has advertised for bids for the contract of building the proposed city hall to be opened May 20, and as soon as the contract is awarded, it is expected that work will be started on the new structure.
