

Mrs. E. J. Kennedy Dies Suddenly, Libertyville

Mrs. E. J. Kennedy, of Libertyville, was found dead in bed early last Friday by her husband who went to her room to call her.

Death was due to heart trouble, but Mrs. Kennedy had been in poor health since August 29, 1928, when she was stricken with typhoid fever.

Besides her husband, Edward J. Kennedy, the deceased left eight children: Joseph, of Libertyville; Mrs. John (Margaret Hanlon), Libertyville; Mrs. L. B. (Jennie) Amann, Waukegan; Frank, of Libertyville; and Mrs. Paul (Rose) Kohout, of Libertyville. Two brothers, Michael H. Redmond, of Lake Forest, and Charles, of Everett, also survive.

The deceased was born Dec. 4, 1863, at Everett, and was married Oct. 17, 1899, and lived in Lake Forest until 1911 when the family moved to Libertyville township. In 1917 they moved into Libertyville. Funeral services will be held Monday at St. Joseph's church.

HUGE SUMS BEING SPENT ON HIGHWAYS

State and Local Governments Expenditure Much More Than Federal

State and local governments are now expending the stupendous sum of \$1,500,000,000 annually for construction of roads. To this amount the federal government is contributing only \$75,000,000 or approximately 5 per cent.

Under the war excise tax, which was the last hang-over war levy repealed, motorists paid into the treasury \$1,100,000,000, while the federal government has expended approximately \$660,000,000 under the federal aid highway act. This leaves a balance of nearly \$500,000,000 still due the car owners of the nation.

The present federal aid highway system of approximately 200,000 miles of important interstate roads has been only one-third completed, and under the present program it will require at least ten or 15 more years to complete this important program.

Ratio Increases

There were 40 motor vehicles registered in 1928 to every mile of improved highway, while the ratio ten years ago was 17 motor vehicles to every mile. This clearly shows that highway-building agencies are not keeping pace with the increase in number of motor vehicles.

The federal government, through the use of the highways for mail

and parcel post delivery, for military purposes and other governmental activities, has been one of the principal beneficiaries of improved highways. It should therefore assume a greater part of the burden of building them, and this would in turn help toward the solution of the farm problem by facilitating the distribution of agricultural products.

Girl Falls Through Skylight at Waukegan

Jane Ward, 12-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Ward of Waukegan, suffered a fractured rib, a fractured nose and innumerable bad bruises following a plunge through a skylight on the third floor of the Lee Shop building at 5 North Genesee street Waukegan to the floor below, last week.

Police had to break down the door of the Lee Shop to get to the child who lay, injured and suffering on the floor of the shop with the locked door between her and her frantic mother.

Mrs. Ward and the children had gone to the building last night for Jane to take an elocution lesson from Miss Lillian Ward of Kenosha who conducts a studio on the third floor of the building.

Evanston Opticians to Open Branch Here

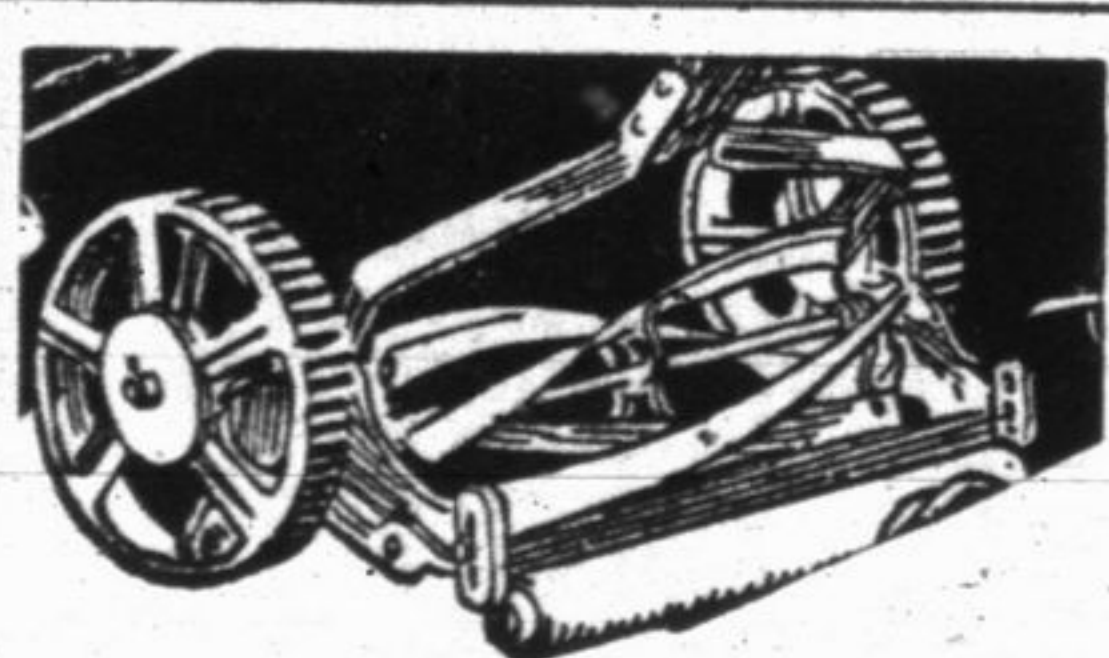

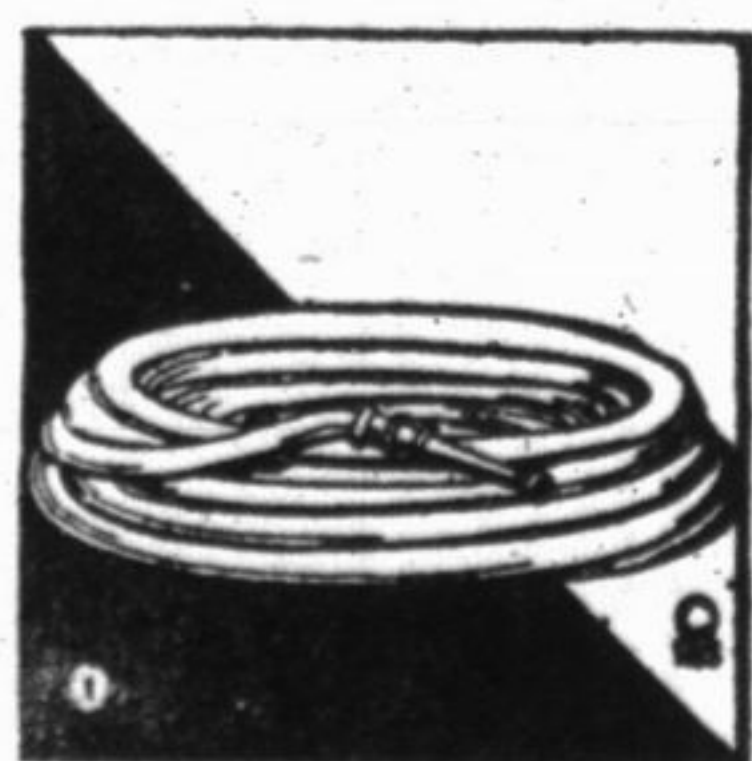
