The new officers will have charge of this meeting and there will be business of importance for consideration and appointment of committees for the ensuing year.

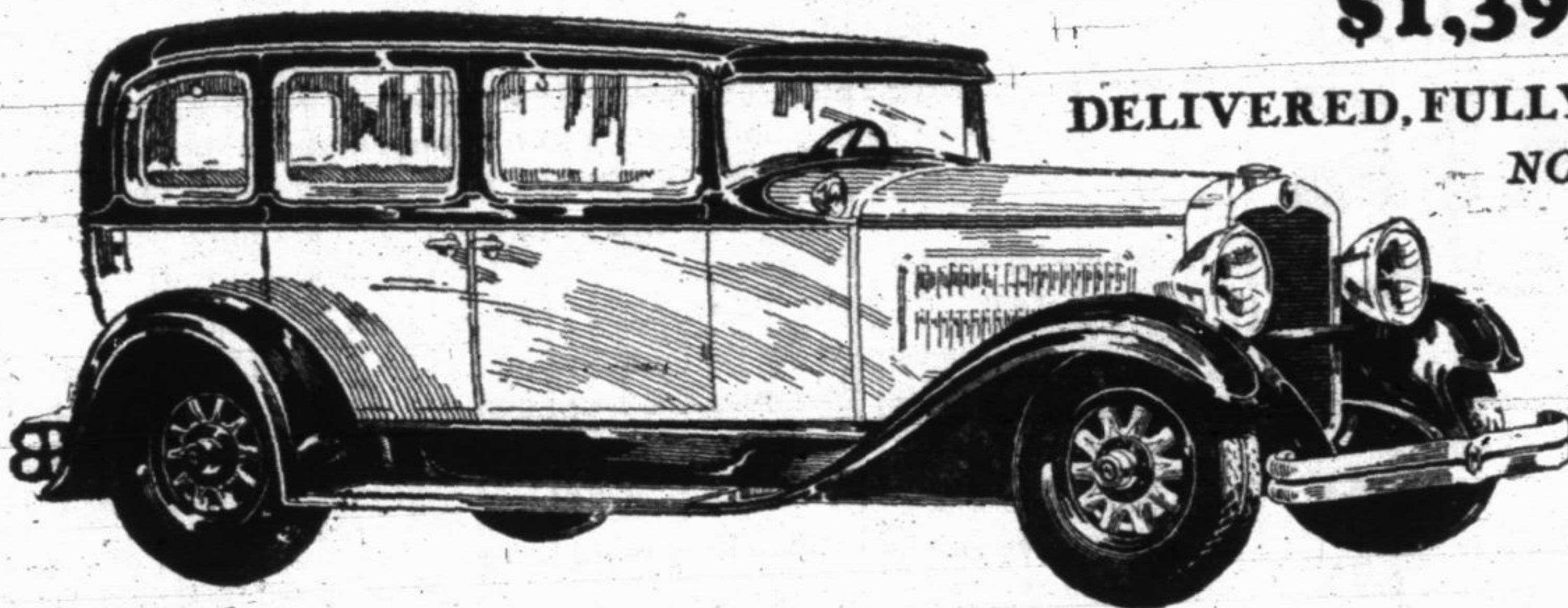
