BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

Requests that the Waukegan city council take immediate action to bring the lake front highway issue before the voters at as early a date as possible were made before the city council by a group of citizens last week.

Plans for the remodeling of the proposed city office building in Waukegan on the Figley tract as prepared by City Engineer Henry Bleck were approved at the meeting of the city council last week.

With the assistance of a number of relatives and close friends, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest H. Brown, Sr. of Libertyville celebrated the passing of their fiftieth wedding anniversary

recently at the home of their son and wife, Mr. and Mrs. E. H. Brown, Jr., in that city.

Members of the Waukegan zoning board of appeals last week entered into a unanimous decision that Walter H. Nibelink, building commissioner of that city had been in error in issuing a building permit to the Green Mill Cleaners to construct an addition and ordered the permit revoked.

Ben Barrett, who promoted the Police History of Waukegan a couple of years ago only to earn a sentence of six month in the county jail on a charge of operating a confidence game, was caught by Los Angeles, Calif., police on a charge of murder and robbery Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle was advised last week.

Inauguration of the exchange pre-flix telephone system in Waukegan will be started in June according to E. A. Judd, commercial manager of the Waukegan branch of the Illinois Bell Telephone company.

The gap in Sheridan road between Zion and Winthrop Harbor, where a part of the road was washed out, has been repaired and opened to traffic. The culvert south of Zion is not yet completed.

William Mihan, 10, who has been held at the Detention home as a dependent since the night two weeks ago when his father, while intoxicated, shot and killed Arthur Jadrich, who had engaged in a drinking bout with him, in North Chicago, last week was ordered to remain in the Detention home by Judge Martin C. Decker, sitting in juvenile court. The mother, Harriett, who was in court, agreed that the child should stay there until school was out.

Waukegan Plans Fete of Historical Nature; Recall Lincoln Visit

An historic fete which promises to eclipse anything of the kind ever attempted here will be presented in Waukegan on June 15, by the Waukegan-North Chicago Goodfellowship association. It promises to be a definite contribution to city and county historically and artistically.

The first meeting of the program committee of the Old Waukegan Fete, was held last week at the home of John W. Barwell.

Elaborate plans are being made for the city-wide affair, which will carry spectators and participants back to the days of Abraham Lincoln. The fete will commemorate one of the greatest days in the city's history—the day that Lincoln paid Waukegan a visit to make a speech.

Various exhibits and displays in keeping with the day will be on view during the afternoon and evening. Old-fashioned gardens, antiques, homes of historic interest, the first books and newspapers of Little Fort (now Waukegan)—all of these and more will be woven into a day that will point back from the eightieth to the first birthday of Waukegan.
