### Find Bodies of Four Men Drowned from Boat in Fox Lake Last Week

After a search of two days members of the Fox Lake fire department last week found the bodies of three men and a boy, missing for four days, in the waters of Pistakee bay. The bodies, lying close together in about ten feet of water, were caught on the hooks of a dragnet used by the searchers.

The four, Edward Jorgenson, 35 years old, of 4347 West North avenue, Chicago; his son Robert, 8 years old; Kenneth Tadden, 1307 Wellington avenue, Chicago, and John Gors' of Mount Prospect, Ill., had gone out on a lake in a rented boat to spend the day in fishing.

Indications are that the small boat was swamped during a storm that swept over the lake in the afternoon.
