Spurred by the fears of his bride of ten months that he has met with foul play, police of Highwood have started a search in Chicago for William Phelps, 29-year-old ex-soldier, who has been missing from his home since early Monday morning.

According to the investigation thus far conducted, Phelps went to Chicago at 8:30 Monday in search of work. He had a round trip ticket and expected to be back in time for dinner at night. He did not return and a canvass of his friends in Chicago failed to reveal any trace of him.

The police were at a loss to account for his disappearance so far as could be learned he had no enemies and his home life was ideal. Phelps was in the army and stationed at Fort Sheridan when he was married ten months ago and the young couple had been very happy, according to friends. Three months ago he received his honorable discharge from the army and started to work as a salesman.
