New Limited Train on N. S. Line Early Monday Mornings; Its Schedule

Addition of a new Milwaukee-Chicago limited train and a change in early morning express service to Chicago from Kenosha and intermediate points became effective Monday, May 20, as supplementary features of the new operating schedule of the Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee Railroad (North Shore Line), it is announced by Roy Thompson, traffic manager.

"For the convenience of week-end visitors to Milwaukee an additional Chicago limited is operated on Mondays only leveling Miles in the Monday at 4:05 a.m., (Standard time). This train leaves Racine at 4:39, Kenosha at 4:52, and Waukegan at 5:18 a.m., operating over the Skokie Valley Route anad arriving in Chicago at 6:30 a.m.," said Mr. Thompson.

"For the accommodation of North Shore Line customers desiring earlier arrival in the Chicago Loop, the express train previously leaving Kenosha daily except Sunday at 4:55 a.m., now leaves at 4:52 a.m., daily except Sunday and Monday, arriving in Chicago at 6:30 a.m. On Mondays it will be replaced by the new Milwaukee-Chicago limited,

"The earlier arrival in the Chicago Loop made possible by these changes will be of great convenience both to residents of Chicago who are weekend visitors in cities along the North Shore Line and to Loop workers who live in these cities," said Mr. Thompson.

Approves Lease for Libertyville Bank
