

Add Four Motorcycle Cops to Highway Force

Four more motorcycle policemen will be added to the county highway police patrol by Sheriff Lawrence Doolittle, it was learned last week when it became known that three new motorcycles had arrived and that a fourth would be purchased.

This will increase the county force, which operates under Captain George Heckinger, to ten men, including himself. With a patrol of this size it will be possible to cover all the principal routes in the county.

Those now serving besides Heckinger are deputies William Kelly, John DeSmidt, William Klarkowski, Harry Quandt and Walter Gansberg.

The county furnishes the motorcycles for the men. Three of the new machines have been on the road for more than a day, so that mileage can be piled up to a point where the bikes can be put in active use.

Three Lake Co. Men in Bankrupt Court

Three Lake county men, two of them residents of Waukegan, the other living in Lake Forest, have filed voluntary petitions in bankruptcy in Chicago, according to official word received in Waukegan.

H. H. Cassard, of 224 South Victory street, a bricklayer contractor, filed a petition in bankruptcy, in

which he listed liabilities of \$24,375 and assets of \$12,422.

Paul Soderquist of 23 Sumac avenue, a tiler by trade, filed a petition in which he listed liabilities of \$2,409 with no assets.

The Woodland Auto Service of Lake Forest showed liabilities of \$4,675 and assets of \$913.

Provide New Room on Ground Floor of Lake County Court House

Creation of a new room on the ground floor of the county building in Waukegan, which will add to the suite occupied by the highway, surveying and veterinarian departments, was announced last week by the building and grounds committees as an initial step in using all waste space so as to delay the building of an addition.

The front stairway from the main corridor to the ground floor is to be torn out, as it is of little use, and that space will then be converted into a room which will be brightly light so that it can be used for engineers in the surveyor's or county superintendent of highway office.

Creation of this room will halt any plan of changing offices of T. A. Simpson, superintendent of schools, and R. M. Lobdell, highway chief. This had been planned to give Lobdell's engineers better light to work under in their drafting.

Memorial Hall Next

The large hall, known as Memorial hall, which has a small room in connection, will be confiscated for county purposes next in all probabilities, according to Supervisor William J. Obee, of Highland Park, chairman of the building and ground committee.

"This step is a long time removed, it appears now, and by that time the American Legion will have a building that probably will have a meeting place for patriotic societies," he stated.

Although an addition was built to the court house in 1923, that doubled the floor space, the building has cramped several offices in the last two years.

"By utilizing all space I believe that it will be possible to eliminate further building for several years to come," Obee declared.
