Says Voliva May Start Colony in Palestine; Now Touring in Europe

That Wilbur Glenn Voliva, general overseer of the Christian Catholic Apostolic church in Zion contemplates establishing a religious community in Palestine, colonized by residents of Zion, is the statement that is being conveyed to his faithful followers, reports the Waukegan Sun, which continues:

At the present time the general overseer, accompanied by Mrs. Voliva and a party of leading Zion residents, is engaged in making a tour of Europe. Among other places they

He is quoted as having said that on these two trips he took different people in order that he might obtain their opinion and advice on the proposition of establishing a second city of Zion.

"On my next trip to Palestine I will take a shipload of Zion residents," he is said to have remarked.

Complete details of the reported plan to start a new religious colony in the Holy Land have not yet been received in Zion—merely the brief statement that such a plan probably will be put into effect. Voliva is expected to complete a statement on the project when he and his party return from their European trip within the next few weeks.

Establishment of a colony in Palestine is said to have been a pet scheme of Voliva for a number of years.

First of Four New County Cops Starts

Sheriff Doolittle last week started one of his new motorcycle policemen on the road and admitted that he would add three more about June 1 when traffic becomes heavy and unwieldy.

Frank Suhadolnik, Jr., of North Chicago, was the patrolman given a motorcycle. The sheriff refused to disclose the names of the men to be added to the force later but admitted that he was swamped with applications to such an extent that a careful investigation would have to be made.

The county highway force operates under Capt. George Skinger, whose men include William Kelly, John DeSmidt, Walter Gansberg, Harry Quandt and William Klarkowski.

Four of them purchased new machines so that their motorcycles, which are the property of the county, can go to the new men who face the prospects of riding for the short summer season alone. The regular force has full time employment.

Expect to Complete Dismiss Two Hearings

The State Highway department is to complete the paving of Route 176, that will extend from Lake Bluff to Wauconda to Burton's bridge on the McHenry county line, this summer, it was indicated today when it ordered the dismissal of two condemnation proceedings in circuit court and

had a third set for hearing, says the Waukegan Sun.

Dismissal of the two hearings, against George Duberville and V. D. Kimball, both owners of property in the village of Wauconda, indicated to R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, that the states does not intend to pave through the half-mile in the limits of Wauconda.

Kimball and Duberville have refused to give property for right-of-ways.

The condemnation proceedings against the Sheahan property was set for June 3 by Circuit Judge Claire Edwards at the motion of Assistant State Attorney S. H. Block. Paving is completed from Bluff to Wauconda.
