One of these combinations I am giving you this week and I hope you will try it, for I think you will like it very much. In this recipe I use tart apples and orange juice with the field-Shields Twnp. High School Date of bananas and this seems to bring out the very best flavor of the bananas.

Scalloped Apples and Bananas

4 large tart apples 3 large bananas

Plain Frozen Mousse

½ pint whipping cream

2 tablespoons sugar

2 tablespoons white corn syrup

A few grains of salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

Whip the cream until thick, add the other ingredients, place in the freezing unit of your ice box and leave for at least three hours.
