

Sheridan Road Open Now South of Zion

Sheridan road over the culvert, located between Beach road and the south limits of Zion, which has been closed for nearly two months, was opened to traffic at noon Sunday, according to Waukegan papers.

It is reported that the approaches and surface of the culvert will be surfaced with temporary materials for more than a year to permit settlement of the earth, before a permanent paving is placed.

The culvert, which originally had a width of 40 feet, is anticipated to be widened to 40 feet in anticipation of the eventual widening of the pavement on Sheridan road to a width of 40 feet from Chicago to the state line.

Rumors state, however, that the

state highway department may tear out the culvert on Sheridan road at the Glen Flora Country club and will establish a detour in Greenwood avenue, North avenue and Holdridge road.
