Railroad Bars Old Red Flannel Shirt

The old red flannel shirt, that color-
ful garment, which stamped a man
as a he-man back in the days when
men were men, is due to follow other
relics of pre-war days into oblivion.
According to a ruling issued this week
by the Chicago, Milwaukee and St.
Paul railroad and received by its
track bridge and signal maintenance
employes in Lake county shirts of
the glowing hue so popular with these
workers must go into the discard,
says the Waukegan Sun.

Employes of the railroad company
in Lake county have held a marked
inclination toward these colorful
shirts and here and there along the
right of way from Deerfield to north
of Russell in the county one might
often have seen a red shirted figure
moving up and down as the worker
tamped a tie or swung on a spike
with a maul.

"Because of the possibility of be-
ing mistaken for signals, wearing of
red clothing about the right-of-way
is forbidden," the railroad officials
decree. "Only persons who are
thoughtful of the safety of them-
selves and others will be retained in
the service of the road."

May Weather Cooler Than Same Month of Last Year Is Report

While the thermometer registered
90 degrees on May 29th, according
to the official record of John O. Laux
of Waukegan, official weather observ-
er of this district for the U. S. De-
partment of Agriculture, weather bur-
eau, it failed by one degree to equal
the record of May 3rd, last year.

Mr. Laux' report for the month
shows that the coolest days of the
last month were May 3rd, 4th and
9th when the thermometer register-
ed 31 degrees. The lowest reached
during May of last year also was 31
degrees. The average temperature
for last month was 54.2 degrees as
compared to 50.2 for May, last year.
Rainfall was heavier last month,

however, than in May of last year,
the precipitation being 3.16 inches
as compared to 1.99 inches in May,
1928.

During May of this year there were
15 clear days, as compared to 18
in May, last year; 8 cloudy days as
compared to 7, and 8 partly cloudy
days as compared to 6. The prevail-
ing wind last month was northeast
—in May last year it was southeast.

The report shows there were
thunderstorms on May 11, 16, 23 and
30th. Mr. Laux reports that home
gardens are behind the general aver-
age due to cold winds and rains. The
ground now is in good condition, he
says.

N. S. Golf Clubs Are Barring "19th Hole"

Practically all of the north shore
golf clubs are eliminating the "nine-
teenth hole" according to notices
which have been sent to members re-
garding this feature, and the co-op-
eration of the members is being asked
in the matter of observance of all
provisions of the national prohibition
law.

Clubs which have sent out these
notices point out that it is a violation
of the prohibition law to have intox-
icants in lockers and failure to com-
ply with the law subjects the clubs
to severe penalties. Employes of the
clubs in several instances have been
notified that serving of "setups" or
in any way aiding in the serving of
liquors to members is a violation of
the law and will subject them to dis-
missal. In each instance the notice
states that the rule in this matter
will be strictly enforced.
