Mrs. Edwin Johnson has been ill with tonsillitis.

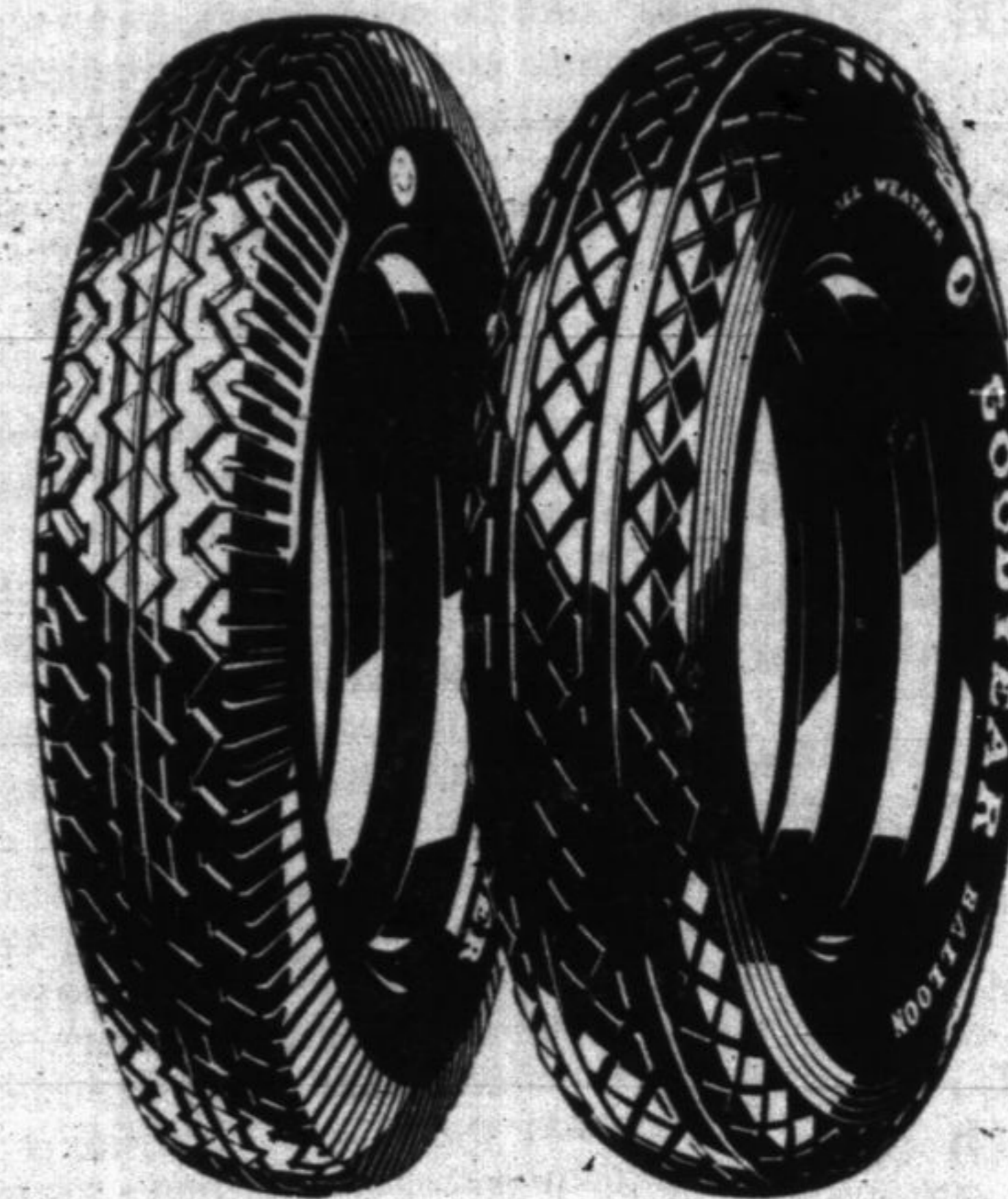
Duncan Reeds, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. D. Reeds, is confined to his home with an injured leg.
