STRATTON PUTS BAN ON BRASS CUSPIDORS

Secretary of State Orders Them From State House; Urns in Their Place

This is the swan song of the stately brass cuspidors which for generations have stood in solemnly imposing rows down the center of state house corridors and in the offices of state officials, says an International News report from Springfield.

Some time ago International News Service commented upon their spotless glory but admitted uselessness.

And now, by an order of Secretary of State William J. Stratton, custodian of the state house by virtue of his office, the 'goboons' are to be shelved along with horsewhips, boot-jacks, bustles, and other relics of a glorious past.

Urns Replace Them

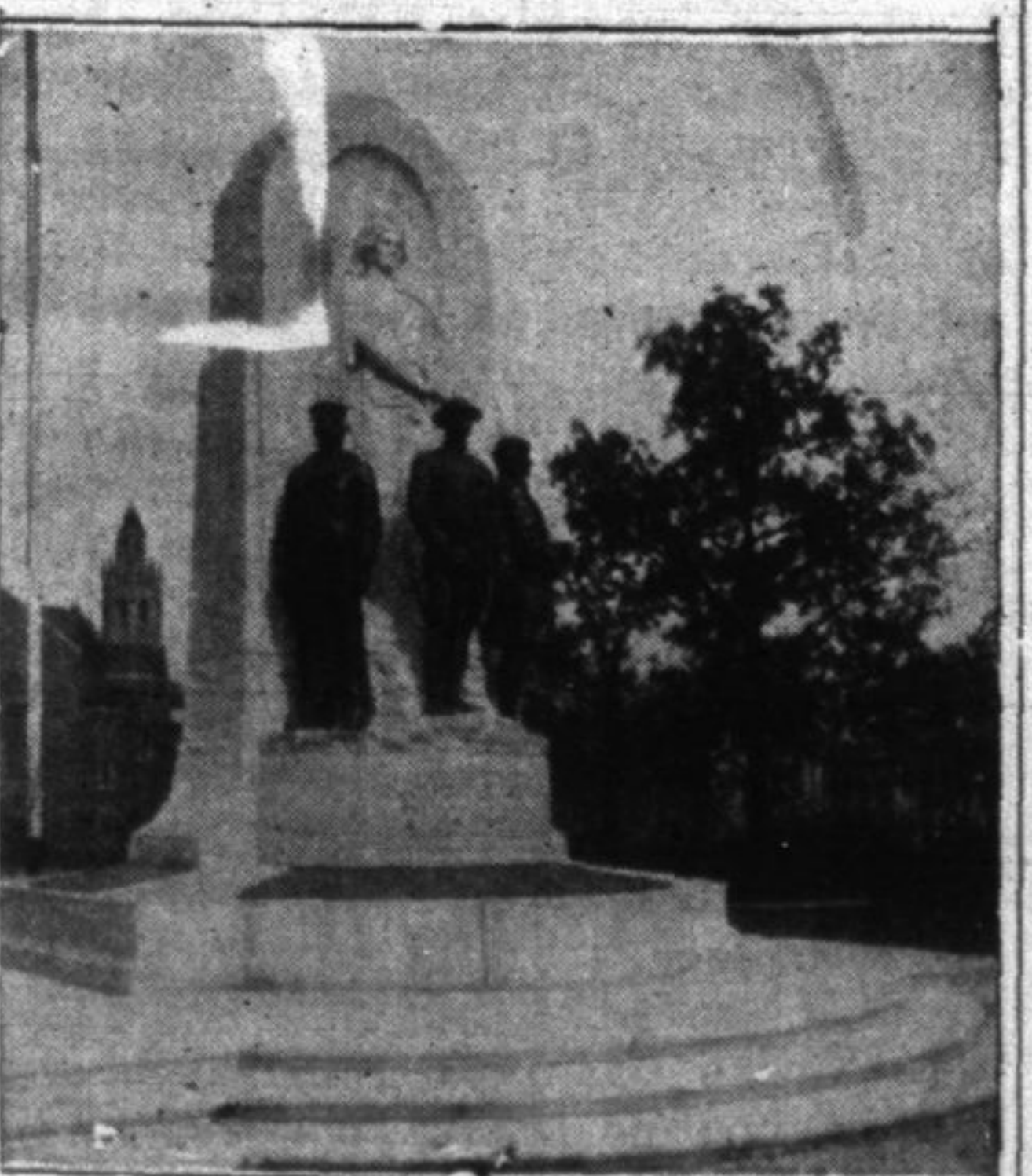
In lieu of the glorified 'spit-kits', beautiful earthen urns, filled with white sand, are making their appearance in the corridors and offices of the capitol. With their installation is marked the virtual disappearance of the tobacco-chewing statesman who could drown an unfortunate fly at ten paces. The new urns offer a wider-mouthed target at which present day cigar and cigarette smokers may flick their snipes.

State house visitors no longer will find it necessary to weave their way through rows of cuspidors and smokers are loud in their approval of the change. So, too, are the janitors who will be relieved from applying 'elbow-grease' to the 'goboons,' which were kept burnished to the 'n-th degree.

Secretary Stratton, it is pointed out, abstains from use of tobacco in any form.

In addition, bulletin board directories which aid the bewildered capitol visitor in finding the offices he seeks, have been moved from the cen-

ter of the corridors to places equally accessible but less obstructive to traffic.

County Share of State School Fund More Since Appropriation Larger

The \$2,000,000 increase for the state distributive school fund was signed last week by Governor Louis L. Emmerson assuring Lake County about the same amount of money that it received last year.

The original appropriation had called for \$8,000,000, the same amount that was distributed through the state last year, until it was decided to increase this to \$10,000,000. Both the senate and house immediately endorsed the increase but fear had been expressed in some circles that the governor, who has red inked most of the plans for appropriations, would kill the measure.

Lake county received about \$90,000 last year but it was indicated, T.

A. Simpson, county superintendent of the schools, admitted a short time ago, that about \$75,000 would be received this year. The increase, he believes, will give the county about \$90,000 again.

Many of the downstate counties participate largely in this fund because the values of the land fail to bring enough taxes to operate the schools. The wealth of Lake county does not bring that plight here.

Hold Driver of Car in Lake Zurich Death

John "Red" Carr of Chicago, under arrest on involuntary manslaughter charges preferred by State's Attorney A. V. Smith, was arraigned before Justice Wilfred Hall last week in Waukegan and released on bail of \$5,000 which was furnished by Joseph Oltusky, professional bondsman. The date of the preliminary hearing has not yet been set.

Carr drove the automobile in which his pal, Frank Carrici, was killed

when it left the road near Lake Zurich while travelling at a high rate of speed and turned turtle.

Following testimony brought out at the inquest Wednesday the coroner's jury recommended that Carr be held accountable for the death of Carrici. State Policeman Arthur Froelich testified at the hearing that skid marks found on the pavement at the scene of the accident indicated Carr was travelling at a high rate of speed.

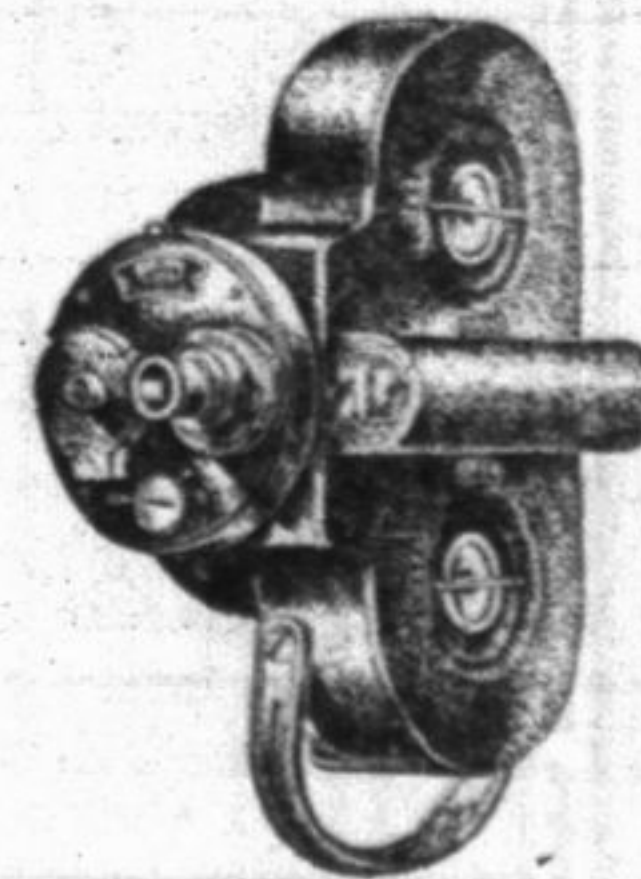
