NEW WATER TANK TO HOLD 500,000 GALS.

pleted early this summer, it is expected, and the new pumps and other equipment installed.

The old standpipe beside the city hall which has done service for many years will be torn down as soon as possible after the new tank is in use, it is planned.

Description of Tank

Five hundred thousand gallons of water, held in a steel tank at an elevation of 90 feet, will constitute the new water supply for the city when the elevated Horton tank is completed. According to reports from the Chicago Bridge & Iron Works, which company fabricated the steel, an erection crew will arrive in Highland Park within the next few days to start work.

When construction is completed Highland Park will have a very unique water tower. By providing for a masonry enclosure around the entire tower and tank the city has combined the advantages of elevated storage with a structure which will be unusually attractive in appearance.

The addition of this tank to the water system is an important improvement, for elevated storage is an economical way of providing a dependable supply of water. The tank will have an ellipsoidal bottom and will be much larger in diameter than it is high. This design reduces the variation between the low water line and the high water line to a minimum and consequently requires less pumping.

Uniform Pressure

The reserve of water which will be kept in the tank will maintain a uniform pressure throughout the entire system. Even during peak load periods, such as occur in the mornings and evenings, the variation in pressure will not be sufficient to interfere with the service of the system. Water flows from the tank by gravity and will always be instantly available for service. This means that the city will have ample fire protection during all hours of the day or night.

Backed by Engineers

Elevated storage in steel tanks of the type which Highland Park has purchased is being advocated by practically all municipal engineers. Mr. G. H. Fenkell, superintendent of the Detroit waterworks system developed the following points in connection with the effects of elevated tanks in water works systems: (1) reduces operating costs at the pumping station; (2) maintains more uniform pressures; (3) reduces capital costs for pumps and mains to meet peak hour demands; (4) improves fire service; (5) maintains pressure during short interruptions of pumping service; (6) less pump manipulation required.

Grohusky in Charge

The erection of the new tank is under the direction of Foreman J. L. Grohusky, who is an experienced steel worker and has been with the Chicago Bridge & Iron Works for a number of years. He is thoroughly equipped to build the city a strictly first class tank.

Local Chamber Opposes State Income Tax Plan

In response to a letter from General Secretary Ferris of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, urging that the influence of the local chamber be exerted in opposition to the state income tax bill now up for third reading in the Illinois legislature, President Paul Udell has sent the telegrams to State Senator Ray Paddock and Representatives Lee McDonough and Richard Lyons from this county, informing them that the Highland Park Chamber of Commerce is opposed to the passage of Senate Bill No. 39, which is the income tax bill.

Ferris' letter says that the bill was due for third reading Tuesday of this week and that its supporters were using every effort to pass it. The bill, the letter says, makes the proposed income tax really an additional tax and not a tax in lieu of any taxes now levied. The legislature is likely to adjourn in a few days, and opponents of the bill hope to be able to prevent its passage at this session.
