

DEERFIELD MEN IDENT VICTIMS

**Coach Found Dead
Wm. Schreiner
Saturday**

Coach, 38, conductor of train at Waukegan and Madison, and a resident of Deerfield, was found dead in his Ford car on Waukegan road about 11 p. m. A fractured skull, a broken jaw and a laceration of the neck, evidently from a fall, were the wounds described in the inquest held about 11 p. m. at the office of the coroner. There were indications that the driver had struck a tree, fallen off and on the road, and that the driver may have been killed.

It was returned that the cause of his death from injuries to the automobile he was driving on the road and struck a tree, that the accident occurred about 100 feet south of Hazel Waukegan road, during the night of June 10, or early morning of the 11th. The driver had closed his station wagon at about 10 o'clock and drove north to the station where some one was waiting to buy a car. The operator at the station reported that the man was not at home. He was, as far as known, until he was found, and indications were that he had been dead some time.

Following the widow and two daughters, 20, and Clara, 12, were notified at the inquest as to the fact that the father closed the filing of the inquest.

Coach Found Dead
Wm. Schreiner, 60 years old, was found dead in a ditch on the road near North-ly night, the victim, of an automobile accident.

Every exhibitor must furnish his own container. In classes, 1, 2, 3 and 7 milk bottles should be used. Flowers should be exhibited with buds removed. The foliage should not be removed.

In class 6 exhibitor should furnish an end table.

Judges may withhold ribbons for not worthy.

Rules for judging flower arrangement exhibits:

Distinction 10; Color harmony 30; arrangement of bloom 30; relationship of plant material to container 30.

There are prizes in all classes: 1st prize, blue ribbon; 2nd prize, red ribbon; 3rd prize, white ribbon.

In class 8 there is a special prize for Garden club of Deerfield members only.

DEERFIELD-SHIELDS GOLF TEAM WINNERS

**Take Suburban League Tourney
at Briergate; Members of
Team and Records**

Coach Peel's Deerfield-Shields golf team closed a very successful season last Wednesday by winning the annual tournament of the Chicago Suburban league, defeating the New Trier team, which was second. The match was played at Briergate country club.

The Deerfield-Shields foursome which took the championship title in this match was composed of William Chambers, Robert Saielli, Jack Thomas and Warren Geary, and the Deerfield squad, pictured elsewhere in this paper, comprised these four and Torrido Saielli, Jack Williams and Robert Cary.

The high schools represented in the league tournament were Evanston, Proviso, New Trier, Morton and Deerfield-Shields, and it is to the credit of the Deerfield players and their excellent coaching by Coach Peel that they were able to carry off the title against such strong opposition.

Win by Two Strokes
Deerfield-Shields team won by two strokes, with a total of 334, and New Trier was second with 336. The individual scores of the members of the winning teams were: Chambers, 80; Saielli, 83; Geary, 85; Thomas, 86; New Trier individual scores: Weed, 79; Hicks, 82; Molan, 86; Kruger, 89.

During the season just closed the Deerfield-Shields golf team has won nine matches and has lost only two. The same boys will be back in school next year, with the exception of Chambers, who is graduated this year. Chambers took second in the Illinois Interscholastic tourney recently at Urbana, with a score of 80, the winner beating him by only two strokes.

Fine Record
Deerfield-Shields high has won the Illinois Interscholastic tourney three times in recent years, the school's winning representatives being Stupple, "Happy" Martin and Dick Martin. This is a splendid showing for the school and a distinct credit to the fine coaching of Mr. Peel.
