Man Found Wounded in Home; Suicide Attempt Is Belief of Police

With a bullet wound in his chest Frank Gonder, 40 year old carpenter, was saved from death in his home at 1625 Burton avenue, Highland Park, Sunday when a second shot, fired at his head, was heard by a telephone operator who heard the shot, after the telephone had been overturned on the floor, according to the police.

While Gonder declares that someone walked into his house, shot twice at him and then walked out, the police of Highland Park maintain that he had attempted suicide as his gun, with two shots fired, was found in the piano in his home, and several other discharged shells were lying

Sergt. Martin Kopp, who was called, reports that Mrs. Minerva Gonder, his wife, a clerk to a ticket agent for the North Shore Line at Glencoe, had left her husband last Thursday and that there had been considerable domestic trouble of late because Gonder had taken to drinking. Three quart bottles, emptied of wine, and a full quart bottle of home-brew, or the like, were found on the table in the room where Gonder was found shot, the police report.

At the Highland Park hospital where Gonder was taken by police after Miss Ellen Udee, telephone operator at Highland Park, had called them when she heard the shot fired, physicians told the police that Gonder tainly have died from loss of blood had not quick attention been given his wounds.

The theory of the shooting according to the police, Gonder probably drank his wine and then, brooding over his domestic troubles, shot himself in the chest and as he fell, knocked the telephone off the table. The police said he then shot at his own head, the bullet just grazing the scalp and it was this shot that the phone operator heard.

The police believe that after the shooting, Gonder was able to make his way to the piano and hide the gun in the customary place. The Gonders have two daughters, 13 and 8 years old, the younger of whom lived with the father until recently when Mrs. Gonder took her to Chicago, the police say.
