It is said by authorities that he was probably struck by a vampire car which speeded on after the accident. An inquest was held Monday. The body of the man was found lying on the east side of the highway shortly after 11 o'clock Saturday night. How long it had laid along-side of the highway could not be determined but death apparently had occurred some time before it was found.

On His Way Home

Indications are that Schreiner had spent the evening in Northbrook and had started to walk back to Deerfield along the highway when he was run down. He had proceeded but a short distance from the town when he was struck.

Although both the Deerfield and Northbrook police have made an investigation into the affair they have uncovered no clues to the identity of the driver of the death car. It is believed, however, that the machine was headed north into Lake county.

Scheiner, who resided alone in a residence on Center street, came to Deerfield several years ago from Columbus, Ohio. He has been following the occupation of laborer and has worked for various contractors in excavation jobs in the vicinity of Deerfield.

Seeking Relatives

It is believed that he has relatives residing in Ohio and Deerfield police are seeking to locate them.

Schreiner has been in the habit of walking to and from Northbrook to his home in Deerfield and it is known that he spent Saturday evening in Northbrook.

The box-office, Mr. Eckstein explains, will be open every day during the season including Sundays, from 9:30 o'clock in the morning until 10 o'clock at night. Residents of the north shore towns may secure telephone connection with the Ravinia box-office by calling Highland Park 2727. This is a double line, thereby preventing congestion as much as possible.

Seats so reserved, however, must be taken up by 10 o'clock the following morning, or check sent to The Ravinia Company, Ravinia, Ill., by mail or otherwise, to reach the box-office at that time, and tickets will be mailed or held as requested. If reservations are made on the day of the performance for which they are desired, the tickets must be paid for by 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

Ordering Seats in Advance

For the benefit of those who desire to order tickets in advance, and who

find it more convenient to have them held until called for, an arrangement which has been entirely satisfactory in the past will be in vogue again this year. Under this plan those desiring such accommodation will make a deposit of \$20, for which a receipt will be given. Seats ordered in advance will then be held until called for at the box-office by the depositor, but must be paid for at that time to leave the total amount of the deposit intact.

There can be no returns, cancellations or exchanges, nor may depositors transfer their rights to the use of others under this plan. When tickets so ordered are not called for, they will be charged to the depositor. These deposits may be made at the Ravinia box-office on or after June 15, or may be made at present by mail addressed to The Ravinia Company, 36 South State street, Chicago. The deposits will be returned at the end of the season in September.
