Wants Swamp Land Case Concluded This Autumn

Attorney Albert Hall, counsel for Frank Hatch, who is suing the state and county to establish title to 700 acres of "swamp lands" in the Grass Lake district, is to insist that the case be completed this fall, he announced late last week.

Testimony has been taken over a period of five years, with the state contending that the property belongs to it while Hatch, whose father before him occupied the land, declares that his family has paid taxes and possessed the property long enough to have title.

The suit was started by Hatch to clear the title to the land and the county was named as the first defendant and later the state was induced to become a joint defendant with the county.

Since then the state has sued in a second suit which nullified the first action.

Millions of dollars are involved as it will determine ownership of the swamp lands all through Illinois.
