AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARY OF PARK OFFICERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. That the salaries of the following Park Officers, for the fiscal year beginning June 1st, 1929, and ending May 31st, 1930, be fixed at such sum as is provided for by this Ordinance for such officers for the discharge of the duties of such office, as required under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the ordinances of the East Park District of Highland Park, during the term of his office, and that such officer shall receive no further compensation from the Highland Park East Park District for the duties of such office during the term thereof.

That the salary of the Secretary and Superintendent of Parks be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Four Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty (\$4,620.00) Dollars.

That the salary of the Treasurer be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.

That the salary of the Chief of Police be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars.

SECTION 2. That the salaries provided for in Section one of this ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the First and Fifteenth day of each month for the preceding half month of their ser-

vice during the term of their office.

SECTION 3. That the salary of the Secretary and Superintendent Treasurer, and Chief of Police be paid out of the general fund.

SECTION 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

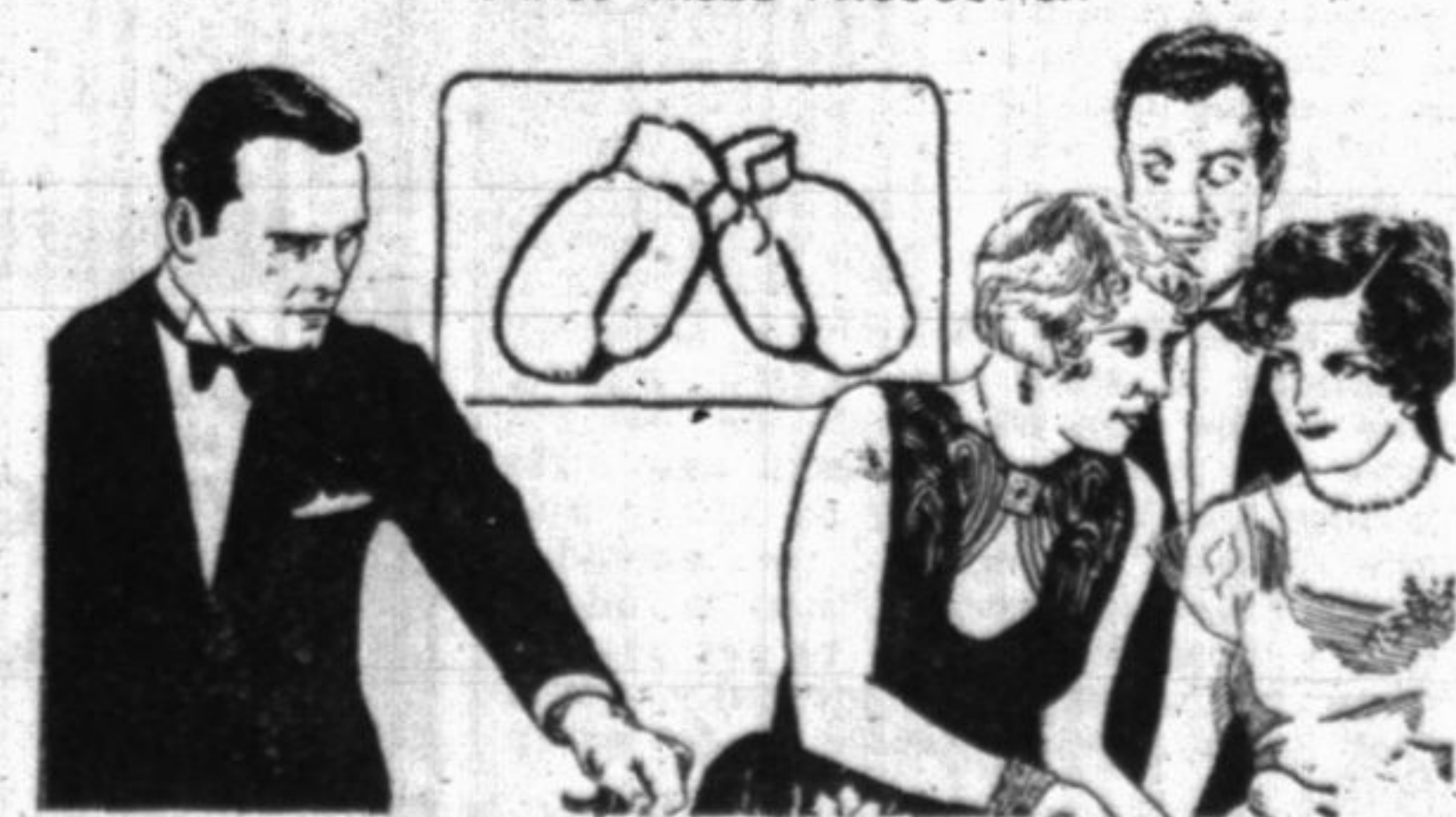
