Park. Ground was broken for the structure October 1, 1928, and the fact that the rooms were ready for use last Saturday indicates the notable progress which was made throughout.

Approximate Cost

The approximate cost of the structure, including the high-class furnishings is reported to be about \$300,000. This is the fifth addition to the Moraine hotel erected since the original building was completed in 1900. The new building is fireproof throughout and the heavy concrete footings go down to the bottom of the ravine.

In order to take care of the increased requirements the capacity of the hotel's laundry has been increased by the addition of a large, cascade model metal washer, a 120-inch ironer and a large press. Additional garage space also has been provided by extending the garage building to connect with the new structure, affording room for about 20 more cars. In order to give a pleasing view to guests whose rooms overlook the garage, a flower garden has been laid out on the flat roof of the garage, which adds to the general appearance of the surroundings.

The new building is equipped with a first-class Atwood vacuum system for cleaning operations, and it is planned ultimately to connect with this system the various floors of the original hotel buildings.

The furnishings of the rooms of the new structure are the last word in quality, convenience and beauty, all the furniture and fixtures having been made to order for this building, including nearly 5,000 yards of carpet, made by the Hartford-Saxony company, and all this carpet is underlaid with 1½-inch ozite padding material. The bedroom furniture is all of solid black walnut manufactured for the annex by the Louis Hanson company of Chicago, and the Beauty-Rest mattresses, box springs and such metal beds as are used were purchased through the T. S. Duffy Furniture company of Highland Park.

Beautiful Bathrooms

Among the outstanding features of the new building is the beautifully appointed bathroom equipment, in which the new colored fixtures are utilized throughout, all of which are made by Kohler company of Kohler, Wis. The bath tubs are built in and in order to conserve the safety of the guests and avert danger of slipping, rubber sheets are placed in the bottom of all the tubs, and handgrips built into the tubs on the outside edges. Each tub has shower fixtures and the color of the shower sheets harmonizes with the prevailing shade of the bathroom fixtures, orchid, green or autumn brown. Each bathroom is provided with pure air by mechanical means and in every way these features are of the most modern type. The plumbing contract was awarded to Vic J. Killian of Highland Park and the cost was about \$25,000. Convenient chutes for disposal of laundry and others for waste paper are provided.

Novel Feature

One of the attractive and novel features of the room equipment is the "signboard" knocker attached to each door. This is a duplication in minia-

ture of the large signboard in front of the hotel on Sheridan road, and each knocker bears the number of the room, of which it is placed. The knockers are of bronze and the device has been patented by Mr. Cushing, making it individual to the Moraine hotel.

The new building is provided with a separate kitchen to provide meal service to the rooms in the annex, and for more extensive requirements in this line, easy access to the main kitchen of the hotel is provided.

From the many commodious porches of the new structure, as well the views of woodland and lake are as from those on the other buildings, attractions which are priceless advantages that go with living in this delightful hostelry. There are 22 large porches on the north annex, making a total of 46 on all the buildings of the hotel plant. All of the porches are screened and equipped with weather-proof and sun-proof furniture of comfortable and attractive design, and opaque shades are also provided to darken the porches for sleeping purposes when so utilized.

Splendid Achievement

Thus once again Mr. Cushing has added another achievement to his many successful ventures in the building up of a fine modern hotel plant. In the 29 years which have intervened since he established the Moraine, he has increased and improved the property year after year, always on the lookout for the best facilities for the comfort and convenience of his guests and adding building after building as the rapidly increasing popularity of the house has demanded. In the new North annex, as usual for him, he has spared neither effort nor expense to make it safe, attractive, comfortable and beautiful, and the result is a building which is a worthy addition to this famous hotel.

Remove Slot Machines to Avert More Thefts
