Sponsor Crippled Children's Work Here

Inaugurating their activities in behalf of the crippled children of Highland Park and vicinity, the Elks lodge has announced the appointment of its welfare activities committee, which shall have charge of the local angles of the state-wide program sponsored by the Illinois Elks association.

The committee chosen by Exalted Ruler A. Abercromby, is headed by John O'Keefe as chairman. Other members include: Wm. Witten, C. R. Moran, J. P. O'Connell, W. F. Gallagher.

In eighty-two other cities throughout the state, with jurisdictions covering every inch of ground in the commonwealth, similar committees are being appointed, and when every Elk lodge has completed its committee organization, 40,000 members will be behind this new movement of Illinois Elkdom.

In a general way, the program is based on a series of clinics reaching into each of the state's eighty-three Elks committees, as rapidly as the local committee is able to prepare therefor. The plan has been endorsed already by many of the state's medical societies, and others are forwarding their approvals from day to day.

It is proposed in the near future to conduct a survey of the crippled children situation in Highland Park, and subsequently to have all thus listed brought before prominent orthopedists who will conduct the local clinics.
