

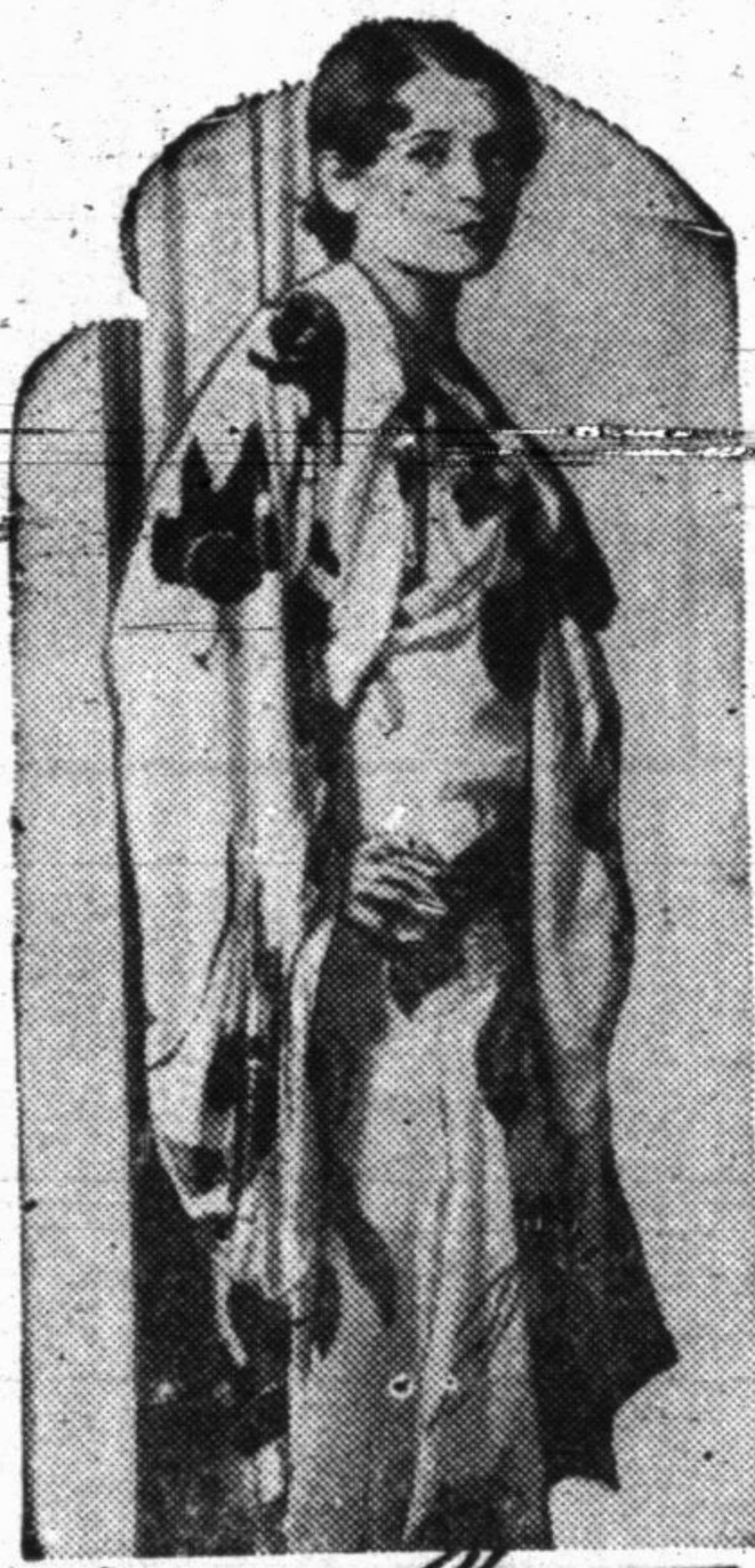
"Very Latest"
