### Find Body of Child Drowned in Channel Lake After 50 Hours

After dragging the bottom of Channel lake for more than 50 hours, Capt. O. W. Fricke and Surfman G. O. Magnusson of the U. S. Coast Guard station at Evanston, Wednesday night of last week, recovered the body of the little 2-year-old Dorothy English, who was drowned the previous Monday afternoon when she slipped from the seat of a boat where she was riding beside her mother.

According to the coast guardsmen, the tiny body was wedged in the mud in the bottom of the lake under about 25 feet of water.

Don English, father of the child, who had been on duty constantly since the drowning, is an official of the Evanston Auto Parts company and conducts a branch plant on South Genesee street in Waukegan.

# Motor Cop Calls Sick Bluff of Auto Speeder
