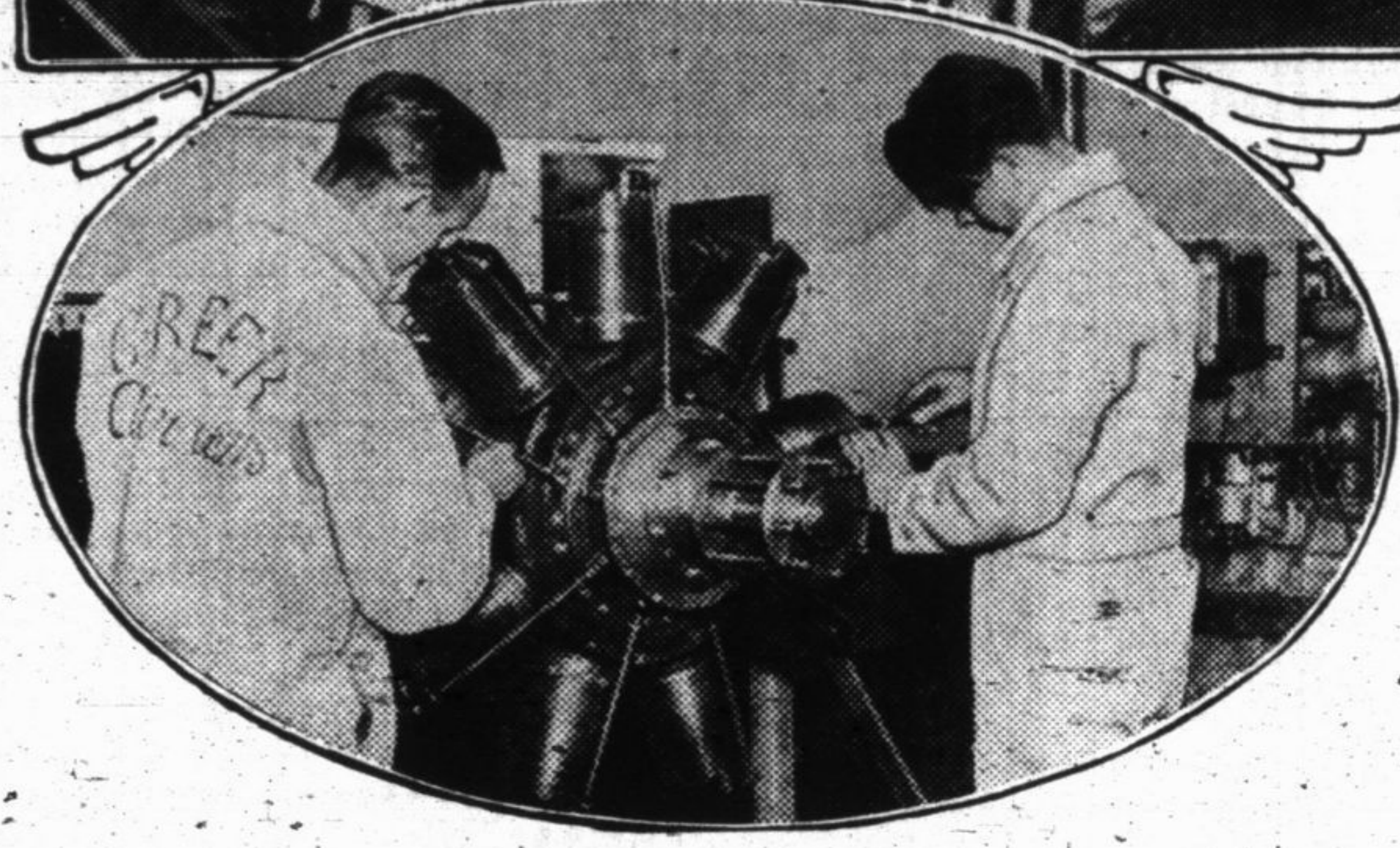
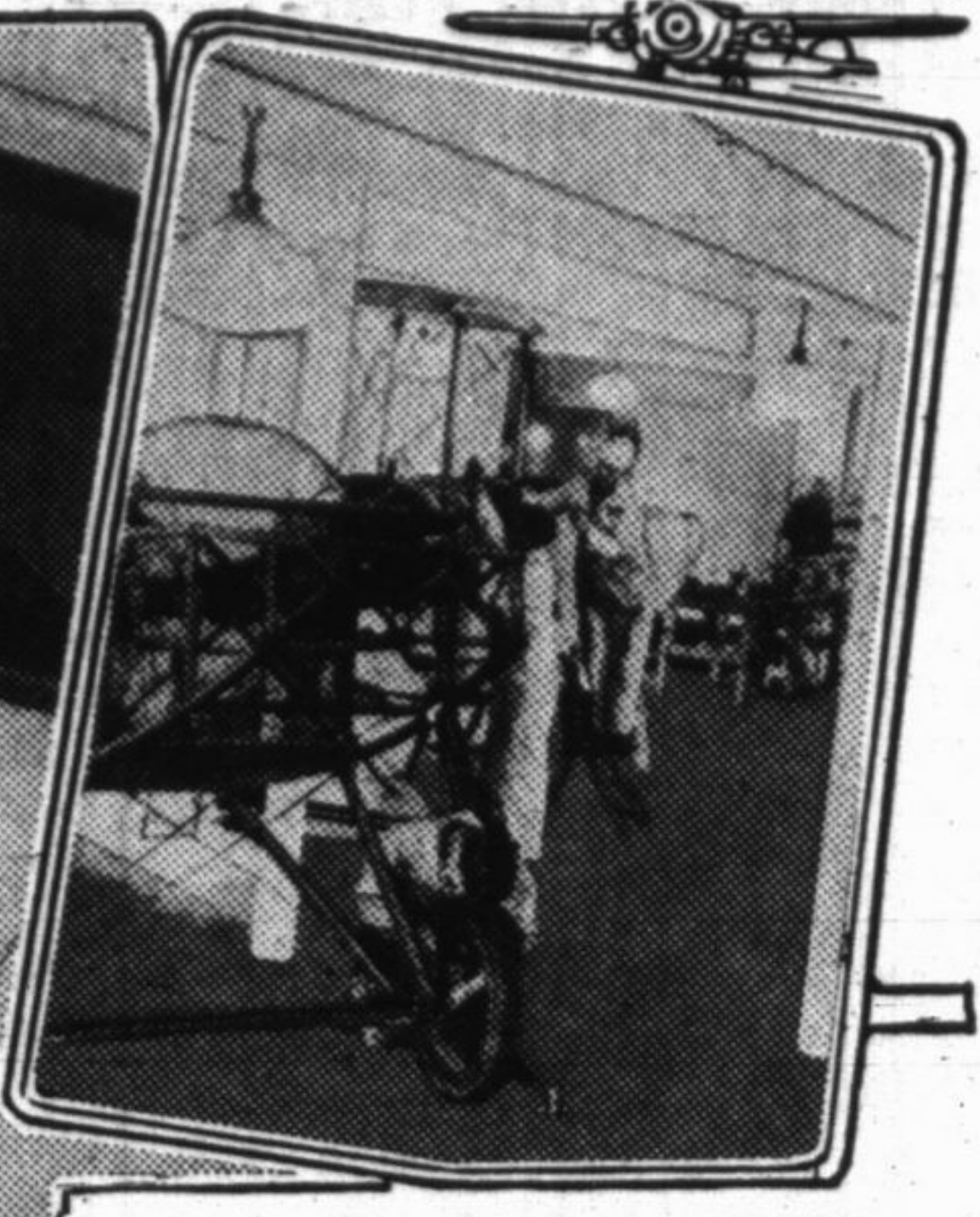

WITH more airplanes being turned out each year than there are pilots to fly them, the finding of sufficient men to operate the established air routes of the country is becoming a problem of major importance. Chicago is helping to solve the problem and now boasts of one of the largest and best equipped flying schools in the country. It is the Greer College of Aviation, located in the heart of what was once motor row, but now rapidly becoming "airplane row." The Greer College of Aviation draws students from all over the United States, as well as from many foreign countries. Its course of

training is modeled closely after that of the United States army and more than 500 students are now receiving ground and flying instruction there. Edwin Greer, president of the college, is one of the outstanding aviation experts of the country and has long been identified with the motor industry. He is a resident of Deerfield, Ill. Back in 1904 he started the Greer Automobile School, which has graduated thousands of automobile mechanics. Aviation, according to Mr. Greer, is destined to play as big a part in the economic and industrial history of the country in the future as the automobile has in the past.

Drive Tunnel Under Ben Nevis, Scotland

The final shot in opening up the 15-mile tunnel driven through Ben Nevis, the highest mountain in Scotland, between Fort William and Loch Treig was fired on February 9, thus completing the main portion of the underground waterway, which is now claimed to be the largest in the world.

Work was begun in 1926, and much of it has still to be lined with concrete before it can be used. It connects up with a hydro-electric works to develop 120,000 horsepower for the British Aluminum Company.

In preparation for the industrial development likely to follow, a new town is being erected near the base of Ben Nevis. The main purpose of the scheme is the manufacturing of aluminum. When the factory is in operation, it is anticipated that employment will be afforded to several thousand workmen.
