Legion Commander To Speak at Rogers Park On Saturday, July 20

Elaborate preparations are being made for the first north shore appearance of Col. Paul V. McNutt, national commander of the American Legion, who will speak before the annual Summer Jubilee of the Seventh district of the Legion (comprising all north shore communities south of Lake county,) to be held on Saturday, July 20, in Rogers Park with the Rogers Park Post acting as host for the occasion.

Legion posts in the entire Chicago area have been urged to send representatives to the Jubilee, which will be one of the "red letter days" each year for Legionnaires in the Seventh and other districts. Another guest at the event, who will appear with Col. McNutt, will be Howard P. Savage, past national commander of the Legion.

State Commander David L. Shillinglaw of Illinois and his staff of State officers will be on hand, with the divisional commanders. The program will consist of a parade starting at 2 o'clock in the afternoon in Rogers Park, in which Wilmette, Winnetka, Glenview, Evanston and other posts will enter their drum and bugle corps, floats and other marching units.
