





NEW LAW REGULATES FISHING IN STATE

Various Alterations Made in Provisions; Fishermen Are Urged to Read

The fisherman or hunter who ventures forth today without first reading up on fish and game laws is liable to run afoul of the warden.

With the beginning of the new fiscal year for the state, a series of changes in the fish and game laws goes into effect. These laws were compiled by the house committee on conservation fish and game, working in harmony with the department of conservation and considering rules laid down under the migratory bird treaty.

New Fishing' Laws

The new fishing laws follow:

Catching of trout (except the lake trout) by other means than hook and line prohibited. Season, April 16 to August 31.

Ten per day limit on trout, pike, or pike perch, and bass.

Twenty-five per day limit on crappies, perch, sunfish, goggleeye and blue gills.

Minimum size for trout, seven

Minimum size for pickerel, and

pike, or pike perch, twelve inches.

Use of Gill nets prohibited except
on Lake Michigan.

Hooks on trout line limited to 100.
Reduces size of mesh in minnow nets from one-fourth to one-eighth inch square.

Changes date for use of seine from April 15 to April 25.

Fishing licenses expire on April 30 instead of April 15.

Fee for non-resident licenses raised from \$1 to \$2.75.

New hunting regulations are: Hunting Regulations

Closed season on wood ducks and eiders until September 1, 1931. Maximum bag of brants and geese

reduced from eight to four.

Hunting of migratory birds from

from ground prohibited.

Foxes omitted from list of furbearing animals in section regulat-

Use of firearms in killing muskrats prohibited. Prohibits setting of traps within ten feet of their houses, or in water within ten feet of any

Shore line.

Use of mechanical devices for frightening of animals from their holes or hiding places prohibited.

Deer season closed until 1939.

Persons who trap are required to visit traps once every twenty-four hours.

Fee for non-resident hunting licenses increased from ten to fifteen dollars.

Monthly sworn statement to department of conservation required of all fur buyers, wholesale and retail.

Fee of ten cents required from trappers for each hide of fur bearing animal; and from commercial breeders of wild game for each bird or animal or dozen of eggs of fraction thereof sold.
