There are no bath houses on this beach at this time but a drinking fountain has been provided and a guard is constantly in attendance and will give swimming instructions to those who desire them and part of the time a lady attendant will instruct the girls in swimming if they so desire it. ## ROAD COMMITTEE IS WORKING ON PLANS

Body Appointed by Governor Is  
Busy; Co. Supt. Lobdell Is  
One of Group

Naming three distinct groups to handle the construction and improvement of state highways out of the two cents of the state three cent gas tax which goes into effect Aug. 1, the organization of the planning committee was completed late last week.

R. M. Lobdell, Lake county superintendent of highways, was named on the sub-committee which will work out the physical plans of the highway construction.

In explaining the part they are to play in the fixing of the road program, officials referred to Gov. Emerson's statement of last Monday, in which the governor outlined the procedure to be followed in Cook county, designed to distribute one-third of the state's gas tax revenue where it will give the most relief to Chicago motorists.

Not Concerned in Location

The general or detailed location of the roads to be improved does not concern the committee, it was explained. Outlining the problems which the group will face, he said:

"It is essential that this committee understand clearly its assignment. You will recognize that the funds in which we are interested are the state's two cents out of the three cent gasoline tax levy, which goes into effect on Aug. 1. The one cent of the tax which is returned to the county is not to be considered by us," the statement says, and continues:

"It appears, therefore, that we have to consider three very definite subjects. First, we must determine accurately from the governor and his highway authorities what portion of the \$33,170,000, which the state will have to spend during the biennium beginning July 1 of this year will be spent in the region of Chicago and just what the boundaries of that region will be the physical plan for spending the money, and the third, what can be done to expedite the construction of the system."

The assignment of the committee of which Lobdell is a member follows:

"Study and recommend on maps and list the following on the system of state bond issue highways:

1. Width of new pavement.
2. Widening of present pavement.
3. Separation of grades at railway grade crossings.
4. Separation of grades at highway grade crossings.
5. Relative importance of each project so that priority of construction may be determined.
