# Army and Navy in Sham Battle on North Shore

North shore towns resounded with the booming of cannon on July 11 when battle maneuvers of naval and army forces were staged at Fort Sheridan.

Sailors from the Great Lakes Naval Training station manned five ships, while a squadron of naval aviators attacked Fort Sheridan from the lake. Aided by artillery the army forces at the fort dug in for the battle. Radio men flew in the airplanes and the three branches of the attacking forces were in constant communication.

The naval forces are designated as the "blue" attackers; the Fort Sheridan defenders as the "red" forces.

United States naval training ships, assigned to participate in the Fort Sheridan attack, were the Wilmette, Wilmington, Paducah, Dubuque and Hawk. Army and navy officers agree the July 11 "battle" was picturesque and the most elaborate of its kind ever staged on the north shore.

# High Water in Lake To Continue, Belief

The present period of high water in Lake Michigan will continue in July and throughout the summer, according to a report from the lake survey department of the United States engineering department.

The report also shows that the level of the water in the lake was 21 feet higher during the month of June than it was in May. The increase for the month, was lower than the average recorded in the same month in former years. Since 1860 the June level has averaged 23 feet above the May level. .

The levels are 2.08 feet higher than the June stage of a year ago, 2.3 feet above the average stage for June during the last ten years, 1.39 feet below the high stage of June, 1886, and 3.81 feet above the low stage of June, 1926.

Based on past records the monthly mean level for July is likely to be about 582.3 and not less than 582.

During June Lake Michigan and Huron was 582.22 feet above mean sea level, Superior, 602.72; Erie, 574.27, and Ontario, 248.46.

# Illinois Second In Automobile Deaths

Illinois ranks second among the states of the union in the number of fatal automobile accidents every year, according to a report from Washington, D. C.

The state's record was \$2,068 motor car fatalities in 1928, with the prospect of an increased number this year, according to a survey made public here by Clay S. White, national authority on traffic regulations, of Wichita, Kans.

"New York led the nation in fatal automobile accidents last year with a total of 2,582," the report of the survey sets forth, "Ohio was third with 1,895, California fourth with 1,870; and Pennsylvania fifth with 1,787." Automobile fatalities for the entire United States totaled 27,500 in 1928.
