NEW PAPER MONEY  
GAINING IN FAVOR

Easier to Handle But Some Con-  
fusion So Long As Old Cur-  
rency Lasts

Advent of the new small-sized pa-  
per currency, \$3,921,000,000 of which  
already has been distributed to Fed-  
eral reserve banks throughout the  
country, finds business executives and  
clerks sharply divided in its reception,  
says a report from Washington, D.C.

While banking and commercial ex-  
ecutives generally favor the smaller  
bills, tellers and clerks whose duty it  
is to handle large quantities of money  
regard them from a different angle.  
They realize that until the old bills  
are redeemed confusion and added  
work will result in handling two dif-  
ferent sizes of notes.

Hold Classes

Classes are being held at some of  
the larger department stores here to  
familiarize their employes with the  
small bills. Clerks are taught to  
"learn the denomination by the pic-  
ture." Many firms have printed  
forms detailing the changes to be  
found in the new issue.

Business men look forward to pos-  
sible mechanical changes necessitated  
by the new style money. They dis-  
like to contemplate altering cash  
drawers and money bins. But they  
realize orderly stacking of bills may  
require changes.

In the end the taxpayer will bene-  
fit by the change for the treasury  
announced saving of approximately  
\$1,500,000 a year will be effected  
through reducing the size of the bills.

Bills Issued

- The bills are:
- \$1 — Face portrait, Washington; back embellishment, ornate.
- \$2 — Face portrait, Jefferson; back embellishment, Monticello.
- \$5 — Face portrait, Lincoln; back embellishment, Lincoln memorial.
- \$10 — Face portrait, Hamilton; back embellishment, United States treasury.
- \$20 — Face portrait, Jackson; back embellishment, White House.
- \$50 — Face portrait, Grant; back embellishment, the capitol.

Chindblom Favors Big  
Harbor for Waukegan

Enlargement and general improve-  
ment of the Waukegan harbor is to  
be urged in congress by Congress-  
man Carl R. Chindblom, as the re-  
sult of a general survey of the har-  
bor made by the congressman on  
Wednesday afternoon.

Congressman Chindblom will seek  
an appropriation to cover the cost  
of extensive improvements and re-  
pairs that he believes will merely  
serve as a start in a comprehensive  
development of the local waterway  
to meet the great demands that are  
to be made upon it in the future.

In the opinion of Congressman  
Chindblom the Waukegan harbor is  
destined to become one of the most  
important on the Great Lakes when  
the deep waterway projects are com-  
pleted. He states that it will become  
an important water and rail shipment  
harbor as well as a terminal for  
local shipping.

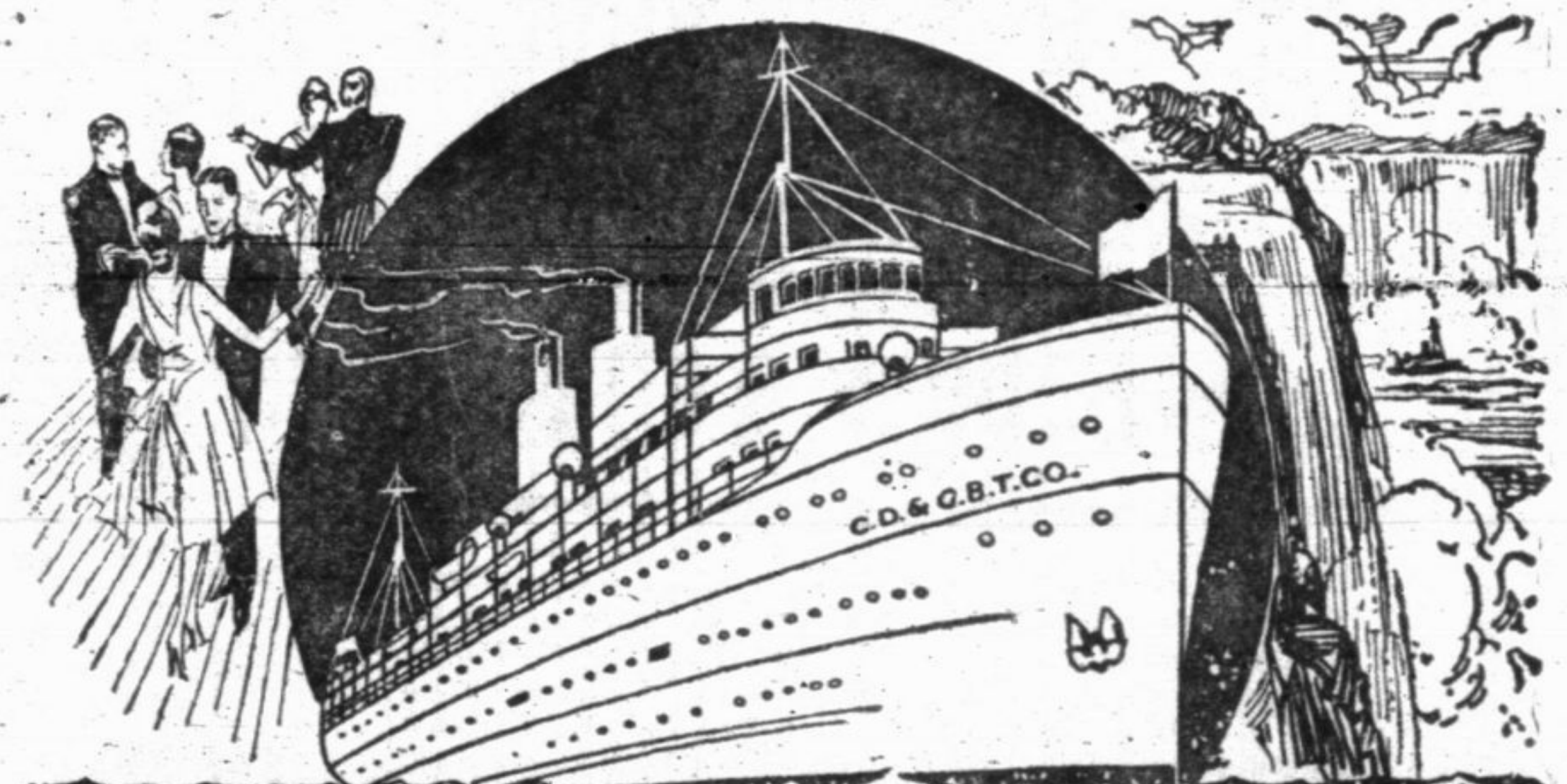
