### BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

#### Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore; County Seat

Mrs. Henry Thiele, of Blanchard road, near Lewis avenue, Waukegan, was painfully injured last week when a loaded hay-rack on which she was working turned over and hurled her overboard.

Mrs. Martha Jane Heath, who has been living at 527 North Milwaukee avenue, Libertyville, the past six months, died last week at the age of 91 years, her death being attributed to old age. She would have celebrated her 92nd birthday August 15.

Reports were current last week in county official circles that Constable George Stried, working out of States Attorney A. V. Smith's office, had visited the operators of racing books and had ordered complete and permanent closing of the books. Col. Smith stated Stried was rechecking to make sure the places were closed.

With more than \$70,000 in building permits issued by Commissioner Walter Nibelink last week, this summer's building program looks as if

it would approach the records of last year and the year before in Waukegan.

Wallace J. Simensen, soldier at Fort Sheridan, was turned over to Chief Deputy Sheriff Fred Brown last week so that Simensen could be taken to Minot, N. D., to stand trial for embezzlement. Simensen was enlisted in Milwaukee, July 8 and was to be transferred to the Philippine service

Chief of Police C. A. Brune, of Zion, has been named a defendant in a suit for \$10,000 damages, brought by Frank Code, of Waukegan, who charged that Brune ransacked his car, in which he and his wife were riding, for liquor.

The cost of operating the Waukegan city schools for the coming year, together with proposed building plans, will cost approximately \$468,000, an increase of \$48,000 over last year.

R. M. Lobdell, county superintendent of highways, last week stated that the county would not receive money from the Illinois gas tax until the end of the calendar year because the distribution is based on the number of cars in a county. The report was current that funds would be available about August 1st.

Waukegan stands eighth in Illi-

nois for the value of its manufactured products, which amounted to \$27,328,209 in 1927, according to a survey made by the Illinois Manufacturers' association based on U. S. Department of Commerce records. It is in ninth place for wages with an annual payment of \$4,808,579 and in 10th place in the number of employes with 3,003.

#### Chances to Get Good Wife, Three in Ten

Man's chances of picking a good, home-making wife are three in ten, according to a survey of the Illinois Federation of Women's clubs. Wives were divided in the survey into five classes:

Home maker or ideal type, 30 per cent; jazz, "can opener" type, 20 per cent; nagging type, 15 per cent; drudge type, 20 per cent; baby doll type, 15 per cent.

A writer in Womans Home Companion, citing the figures, summed up the faults of wives in four of the classes, declaring that they enjoy poor health; they are always tired; they are forever finishing the dishes; they have the children always around; they contract the kimona habit; they go in for delicatessen meals; they are always picking things up; they fill the house with relatives; they don't get around to tidying things up; they go into that after-

marriage slump; they lose their husbands.

"Not all wives," says the writer, have time or money for a thorough making over. Perhaps the modern woman in her enthusiasm for tackling new problems has been a little slow to apply her new knowledge to a solution of the age-old problem of how to get along with a man."
