The switchboard of the Commonwealth Edison company, Chicago, controls the largest private branch telephone exchange of any individual company in the United States.

The value of all manufactures produced in Chicago in 1927 was \$3,478,753,623, an increase of \$190,749,211 over 1923, according to a report just released by the Illinois Manufacturers' association.

There are more than 10,000 miles of gas mains in Illinois.

The average resident of Chicago rides the Surface Lines 311 times a year. In Springfield the average rider travels 94 times a year by street car; in Danville, 93 times; in Rock Island, 83.

A total of 167 industries, new to Illinois in 1928, furnished employment for 6,801 men and 1,701 women.

Lake Michigan Goes on Rampage; Big Wind

Lake Michigan went on a rampage and did big things in a big way Thursday night. Whipped by a stiff northeast wind, the waves ran roughshod over the breakwater at Wilmette harbor, snapping the aft moorings of the Buccaneers' clubship and swinging the large vessel violently about, gravely endangering smaller craft moored in the harbor. It was re-anchored by the Evanston coastguard.

At Evanston, the police turned out a riot squad to watch a section of Sheridan road at Calvary cemetery melt away under the lashing waters and to prevent unwary motorists from getting wet. The highway was undermined for about nine feet back from the lake side, rendering it impassable. Evanston officers reported.

No damage was recorded by Winnetka, Glencoe, Kenilworth or Wilmette police departments.
