First Exalted Ruler of Lake Forest lodge No. 1498, B. P. O. E., he again served the lodge in that capacity during the year just past. He was also a charter member of Highland Park lodge No. 1362, B. P. O. E.; a member of Lake Forest lodge, A. F. and A. M.; of Medinah chapter, the Shrine; of Lodbrok lodge I. O. V., Lake Forest; and of the Svithoid club of Chicago.

#### Emigrated to America

Born in Sweden July 3, 1883, Mr. Jones just recently celebrated his 46th birthday. At the age of 17 he came to America alone; and after getting lost at Ellis Island coming in, came direct to Highland Park, where he secured his first position. Through the influence of his friend, Arthur Meeker, he later secured a position at the Chicago club, and remained there for nine years, going then to Old Elm club.

Mr. Jones was married June 1, 1905 to Miss Freda Froberg, of Chicago, who survives him. The only other members of his immediate family living are three sisters, who reside in Sweden.

The funeral was held Wednesday afternoon of this week, the ceremony being conducted by Highland Park lodge, A. F. and A. M., with the permission of the Lake Forest lodge. The members of the Lake Forest lodge attended in a body. Interment was in Graceland cemetery.

### Waukegan Fourth in Number Babies Born in Suburban Cities

Waukegan took fourth place among cities in the Chicago area for the number of babies born during the year of 1928 according to government census figures just made public but the number 532 for last year was somewhat below the figure of 566 reported for the year of 1927 the report shows.

Oak Park led all of the cities in the state outside of Chicago for the number of babies born during the year. There were 2,533 babies born in Oak Park last year, while 1,872 were born in Evanston during the same period. Both cities reported increases in the number of infants born during the year over the preceding year.

Cicero was lowest among the cities of its class both in the Chicago area and in the state both for the number of babies born and the percentage of births in accordance with the present population.

There were 59,016 babies born in Chicago last year, a decrease of nine-tenths per thousand over 1927. The death toll among persons of all ages in Chicago last year was 39,562, a figure far below the national average death rate.

### Proposal to Enlarge Harbor at Waukegan

Proposal that the Waukegan harbor be enlarged by extension of a portion of the south pier to a point 500 feet south of its present connections with the shore has been made to Congressman Carl R. Chindblom who has given assurances that he will consider bringing the matter to the attention of the United States Engineering department and eventually before congress.

The suggestion for the enlargement of the inner basin of the harbor was made to Congressman Chindblom by Nicholas Larsen, for many years harbor master and who has been identified with the development and progress of the local harbor for a quarter of a century.

Cost to the government would be small in comparison to the merit of the improvement, it is pointed out.

The plan provides for cutting off of the pier at the bend several hundred feet from the shore and extension of the pier southward to or near the present abandoned pier attached to the old Public Service power plant from where it would extend to the shore.

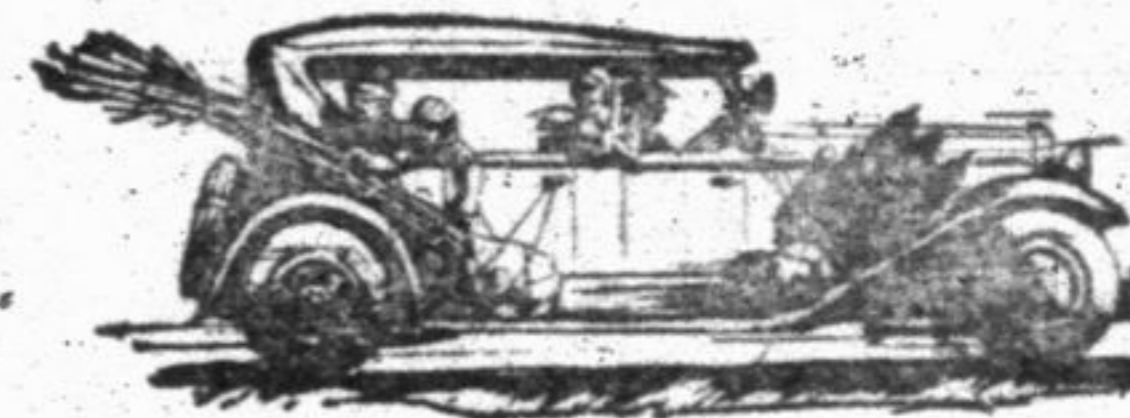
