NORTHBROOK HOLDS PIONEER PAGEANT

Mr. Shepard. The tavern was a half-way station between Chicago and Milwaukee and was used extensively by lawyers traveling to and from courts in both cities.

The name of the township in which Northbrook is situated, Northfield, is carried over from the early days of its history. The township was familiarly divided into four parts, north Northfield, east Northfield, south, and west.

Some of the Early Families

Some of the prominent families of the district were the Steeles, Galloways, Elveys, Will Davises, Adams, Sipleys, Hutchings, Reeds, Russells, Hanleys, and Richards. The Mitchells and the Kiests were early settlers in South Northfield. Among the German settlers who came after the English and New Englanders are Mr. and Mrs. Levi Schinleber and Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Kiest. Both families still live in Northbrook and will take part in the pageant.

Tentative plans for the pageant include fifteen groupings: Colonial background out of which the first settlers came; prairie schooner days, the pony express, log cabin days, and the Indian contacts, impersonations of early settlers by remaining members of their families, gold rush, Forty-niners, Civil war days, early schools, early churches, a picture of

the '80s in song and dance, first railroad in 1871, "Then and Now," contrasting methods of costuming, transportation, machinery, etc.; Spanish war days, the town's share in the World war, beginning of present day civic organizations.

Break in Phone Cable Stops Service for Day

Silence reigned in Libertyville several days last week and 800 voices were stilled due to a break in a telephone cable in the downtown district that left business men hampered through the loss of the utility.

The cable was sheared when a water main was being driven under Milwaukee avenue, the main business thoroughfare, between Cook Memorial park and Lovell's drugstore.

The water main fouled the cable, carrying 400 pairs of wires, and cut it through.

The service from church street north to Grayslake and east of the village six miles was automatically cut off.

Telephone men estimated that between 600 and 800 people, due entirely to the number of four party lines, were without phones.

Repair crews to mend the break were dispatched to the point of trouble immediately with word to rush the job.

Libertyville lost its phone service three weeks ago when a cable was burned through by a fire in a deserted house.
