

Laying of the cornerstone of the new City Hall at the corner of St. Johns and Hazel avenues, Saturday morning by Mayor Benjamin F. Lewis. Story and Mr. Lewis' remarks will be found on an inside page.

Standing to the left of the derrick (in shirt sleeves) is General Superintendent O. A. Pearson. Standing by the stone is Joseph Cabonargi, the general contractor; looking through the derrick just above the little girl's head is V. C. Musser, city manager; immediately to the right of derrick, Chester Harris; next to him, holding level, is Commissioner Julius Zimmer, then Mayor Lewis, daughter and Mrs. Lewis. Between Mr. and Mrs. Lewis is Frederick Hodgdon, architect of the building. Directly behind Mr. Lewis is Commissioner Lyle Gourley; to the right of Mrs. Lewis is Corporation Council Bowen E. Schumacher, next to him being Commissioner Wm. Reay. The man on the extreme right is Mr. J. M. Appel, president of the Highland Park State bank, and next to him on the right (not shown in picture) is standing ex-mayor Samuel M. Hastings. On the left of the derrick in light suit is Paul L. Udell of the Highland Park Press. The workmen and children's pictures, you'll have to figure out for yourselves. Commissioner Wm. J. Brown was absent.
